#### MATERIALS

- 922-205 <u>Lion Brand Ice</u> <u>Cream Big Scoop: Spumoni</u> 1 Ball
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook -Size I-9
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



### GAUGE:

Rnds  $1-4 = about 4 \times 4$  in. (10 x 10 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### NOTES:

Afghan is worked in one piece in joined and turned rounds.

#### AFGHAN

Ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), 2 dc in ring, (ch 1, 3 dc in ring) 3 times, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 4 ch-1 sps and 12 dc (consisting of four 3-dc groups) in this rnd. **Rnd 2:** Turn, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in first ch-1 sp (first corner made), \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp (corner made); rep from \* 2 more times; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 4 corner ch-1 sps and 24 dc (eight 3-dc groups).

**Rnd 3:** Turn, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc) in first sp between 3-dc groups, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, 3 dc in next sp between 3-dc groups; rep from \* 2 more times, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in last corner ch-1 sp; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 4 corner ch-1 sps and 36 dc (twelve 3-dc groups).

**Rnd 4:** Turn, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc) in first sp between 3-dc groups, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, (3 dc in next sp between 3-dc groups) twice; rep from \* 2 more times, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, 3 dc in last sp between 3-dc groups; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 4 corner ch-1 sps and 48 dc (sixteen 3-dc groups). **Rnd 5:** Turn, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc) in first sp between 3-dc groups, 3 dc in each sp between 3-dc groups to next corner ch-1 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, 3 dc in each sp between 3-dc groups to next corner ch-1 sp; rep from \* 2 more times, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, 3 dc in each sp between 3-dc groups to end of rnd; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 4 corner ch-1 sps and 60 dc (twenty 3-dc groups).

Rep Rnd 5 until almost all yarn has been used. **Note:** Each time you rep Rnd 5 you will have 4 more 3-dc groups than in the previous rnd. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
