

Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand[®] Heartland[®] **Tessa Buttoned Wrap**

Pattern Number: L40755



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<u>SKILL LEVEL –</u> Easy+

<u>SIZE</u>

About 18 x 70 in. (45.5 x 178 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Heartland® (Art. #136)
 - 189 Isle Royale 5 balls
 - or color of your choice
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size I-9 (5.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

4 Buttons, about 1 in. (25 mm) diameter Sewing needle and thread

<u>GAUGE</u>

Cable Pattern 1 = about 1 in. (2.5 cm) wide. Cable Pattern 2 = about 2 in. (5 cm) wide. Cable Pattern 3 = about 4 1/2 in. (11.5 cm) wide. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

BPTR (back post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from back to front then to back, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Skip st in front of the BPTR.

FPTR (front post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Skip st behind the FPTR.

FPTRCross (worked over 3 sts) Yarn over, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, sk next Puff, yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then front around post of next st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook; working in front of st just completed, dc in skipped Puff; yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then to front around post of st before the same Puff, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice, sk Puff, yarn over, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice, sk Puff, yarn over, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook. **Puff (worked all in one st)** Yarn over, insert hook in indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop, (yarn over, insert hook in same st, yarn over and draw up a loop) 4 times, yarn over, draw through all 11 loops on hook.



PATTERN STITCHES

Cable Pattern 1 (worked over 3 sts)

Rows 1 and 3 (WS): BPTR around each of next 3 sts.

Rows 2 and 4: FPTR around next st, BPTR around next st, FPTR around next st.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Cable Pattern 1.

Cable Pattern 2 (worked over 7 sts)

Rows 1 and 3 (WS): BPTR around next st, dc in next st, BPTR around next st, Puff in next st, BPTR around next st, dc in next st, BPTR around next st. **Rows 2 and 4:** FPTR around next st, dc in next st, FPTRCross, dc in next st, FPTR around next st.

Note: When working repeats of Row 1, work each BPTR around the post sts only of each FPTRCross.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Cable Pattern 2.

Cable Pattern 3 (worked over 17 sts)

Row 1 (WS): Dc in next 4 sts, BPTR around next 9 sts, dc in next 4 sts. **Row 2:** Dc in next 4 sts, FPTR around next 3 sts, sk next 3 sts, FPTR around next 3 sts; working in front of 3 sts just made, FPTR around the 3 skipped sts; dc in next 4 dc.

Row 3: Rep Row 1.

Row 4: Dc in next 4 sts, sk next 3 sts, FPTR around next 3 sts; working behind 3 sts just made, FPTR around the 3 skipped sts; FPDC around next 3 sts, dc in next 4 sts.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Cable Pattern 3.

NOTES

- 1. Three different cable patterns are worked across each row. We found that after working just a few rows, it was easy to determine where each pattern should be worked but if you like, place a st marker between each of the patterns to keep your place.
- 2. Use the Stitch Diagrams to help you see how to work the cable patterns.
- 3. When working post stitches, you are inserting the hook around the vertical bar of the stitch instead of under the top two loops of the stitch. The side of the work that faces you is the "front", and the side of the work that faces away from you is the "back". For example, to work a FPTR, work as follows:
 - a. Yarn over the hook twice (3 loops on hook).
 - b. Insert hook from front to back to front around post of indicated st, as follows:
 - i. Insert hook from front to back into the space between sts that is immediately before the indicated st.
 - ii. Continue to bring the hook behind the indicated st, and insert it from back to front into the space between sts that immediately follows the indicated st.

- c. Yarn over and draw the loop all the way back around the post of the st to the front of the work and up to the level of the sts in the current row (4 loops on hook).
- d. (Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times (1 loop rem on hook).
- e. Take care to skip the 2 loops at the top of the st into which you would usually work and are now "behind" the post st you just completed.
- 4. The FPTRCross isn't difficult! Just work carefully, step by step.
 - a. Yo, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (2 loops rem on hook).
 - b. Sk next Puff, yarn over twice (4 loops on hook).
 - c. Insert hook from front to back then front around post of next st, draw up a loop (5 loops on hook).
 - d. (Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (1 loop rem on hook).
 - e. Working in front of st just completed (this means you simply bring your hook in front of the st you just completed in steps a-d, before working the following instructions), dc in the skipped Puff.
 - f. Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then to front around post of st before the same Puff (you are working around the st before the Puff), draw up a loop (4 loops on hook).
 - g. (Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice (2 loops rem on hook).
 - h. Sk the Puff, yo, insert hook in next st, draw up a loop (4 loops on hook).
 - i. Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

<u>WRAP</u>

Ch 67.

Foundation Row (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc) and in each ch across – you will have 65 dc at the end of this row.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, BPTR around each of next 3 sts (Row 1 of Cable Pattern 1 worked), dc in next st; working Row 1 of each pattern, work (Cable Pattern 2 over next 7 sts, Cable Pattern 3 over next 17 sts) twice, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 7 sts, dc in next dc, Cable Pattern 1 over next 3 sts, dc in top of beg ch.

Rep Row 1 working next row of each Cable Pattern until piece measures about 69 1/2 in. (176.5 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work. **Last Row:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING


Following schematic for placement, sew buttons to wrap. Use spaces between sts on opposite edge of Wrap for buttonholes.


Weave in ends.


