SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZE

About 24 x 54 in. (61 x 137 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Heartland® (Art. #136)
 - 105 Glacier Bay 5 balls
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

1 ripple = about 4 1/2 in. (11.5 cm)

measured from peak to peak.

8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in ripple pattern.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

dc2tog (dc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

dc3tog (dc 3 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

dc4tog (dc 4 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 4 times, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 3 sts decreased.

NOTES

1. Shawl is worked in a ripple crochet pattern. The ripple pattern is easy to do, but it's important to remember that you may need to work several rows before the ripple pattern becomes clear.
2. The ripple in this design is created by skipping sts on sc rows and working dctogs on dc rows to form 'valleys' and working (sc, ch 2, sc) on sc rows and (dc, ch 3, dc) on dc rows to form 'peaks'. Take care to work valleys centered over valleys peaks into the ch-sp of peaks of previous row.
3. An edging is worked across both short ends of Shawl.

SHAWL

Ch 241.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 9 ch, *ch 2, sc in next 9 ch, sk next 2 ch, sc in next 9 ch; rep from * to last 10 ch, ch 2, sc in last 10 ch – you will have 218 sc and 12 ch-2 sps forming 12 ripples at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 3 (does not count as st), turn, sk first st, dc2tog, (ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st) 3 times, ch 1, sk next st, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, dc in next 7 sts,

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*dc4tog, (ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st) 3 times, ch 1, sk next st, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, dc in next 7 sts; rep from * to last 3 sts, dc3tog – 144 dc and 12 ch-3 sps.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in first 9 sts, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc in next st, sc in next ch-1 sp) 4 times, *sk next st, sc in next 8 sts, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc in next st, sc in next ch-1 sp) 4 times; rep from * to last dc2tog, sk dc2tog, sc in top of turning ch.

Rows 4-7: Rep Rows 2 and 3 twice.

Row 8: Ch 3 (does not count as st), turn, sk first st, dc2tog, dc in next 7 sts, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, (ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st) 3 times, *ch 1, sk next st, dc4tog, dc in next 7 sts, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, (ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st) 3 times; rep from * to last 4 sts, ch 1, sk next st, dc3tog.

Row 9: Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, (sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next st) 4 times, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 8 sts, *sk next st, (sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next st) 4 times, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 8 sts; rep from * to last dc2tog, sk dc2tog, sc in top of turning ch.

Rows 10-13: Rep Rows 8 and 9 twice.

Rows 14-49: Rep Rows 2-13 three times.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Edging

From RS, join yarn with a sl st in corner to work across a short edge of Shawl.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, working in ends of rows, work sc evenly spaced across short edge.

Fasten off.

Rep edging across other end of Shawl.

Weave in ends.

ch = chain

ch-sp(s) = chain space(s) previously made

dc = double crochet

rep = repeat

RS = right side

sc = single crochet

sk = skip

sl st = slip stitch

st(s) = stitch(es)
