SKILL LEVEL – Intermediate

SIZE

About 18 x 50 in. (45.5 x 127 cm), including border

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Heartland® (Art. #136)
 - 130 Bryce Canyon 3 balls
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

12 buttons, 3/4 in. (19 mm) diameter

GAUGE

1 pattern rep = about 3 1/2 in. (9 cm) in Flower Lace pattern.

Note: One pattern repeat consists of a "flower" (all clusters and chains between a pair of sc sts on each row).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

3-tr Cl (3 treble crochet cluster) (Yarn over) 2 times, insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 2 times (2 loops rem on hook), *(yarn over) 2 times, insert hook in *same* st and draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 2 times; rep from * once more, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

2-tr Cl (2 treble crochet cluster) (Yarn over) 2 times, insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 2 times (2 loops rem on hook), (yarn over) 2 times, insert hook in *same* st and draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 2 times, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

NOTES

1. Shrug is worked as a rectangle in Flower Lace pattern. A border is worked around the entire outer edge of the rectangle.
2. Piece can be buttoned to wear as a sleeved shrug, vest, or cowl, or left unbuttoned as a Shawl.
3. The ch-1 sps of the last rnds of the border are used as buttonholes. Buttons are sewn to opposite ends of the 2 long edges of the rectangle following Assembly Diagram.

SHRUG

Ch 42.

Beg Flower Lace Pattern

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Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, *ch 3, sk next 3 ch, (3-tr Cl, ch 7, 3-tr Cl) in next ch, ch 3, sk next 3 ch, sc in next ch; rep from * across – you will have 5 pattern reps at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 5 (does not count as a st), turn, *3-tr Cl in 3rd ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2-tr Cl in top of 3-tr Cl just made, sc in center ch of next ch-7 sp, ch 3, 2-tr Cl in sc just made, 3-tr Cl in first ch of next ch-3 sp; rep from * across.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, 2-tr Cl in top of first 3-tr Cl, ch 3, sk next 2-tr Cl, sc in next sc, ch 3, sk next 2-tr Cl, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl, *ch 7, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl, ch 3, sk next 2-tr Cl, sc in next sc, ch 3, sk next 2-tr Cl, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl; rep from * across.

Row 4: Ch 7 (counts as tr, ch 3), turn, 2-tr Cl in 4th ch from hook, 3-tr Cl in first ch of first ch-3 sp, 3-tr Cl in 3rd ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2-tr Cl in top of 3-tr Cl just made, *sc in center ch of next ch-7 sp, ch 3, 2-tr Cl in sc just made, 3-tr Cl in first ch of next ch-3 sp, 3-tr Cl in 3rd ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2-tr Cl in top of 3-tr Cl just made; rep from * across, tr in top of turning ch.

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, ch 3, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl, ch 7, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl, *ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, ch 3, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl, ch 7, 3-tr Cl in next 3-tr Cl; rep from * to turning ch-sp, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of turning ch.

Rep Rows 2-5 until piece measures about 48 in. (122 cm) from beg; end with a Row 3 as the last row you work.

Last Row: Ch 7 (counts as tr, ch 3), turn, 3-tr Cl in first ch of first ch-3 sp, 3-tr Cl in 3rd ch of next ch-3 sp, *ch 3, sc in center ch of next ch-7 sp, ch 3, 3-tr Cl in first ch of next ch-3 sp, 3-tr Cl in 3rd ch of next ch-3 sp; rep from * across, ch 3, tr in top of turning ch.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Border

Note: For Rnd 2 to work nicely, it is important to work an odd number of sts across each of the 4 edges of the rectangle. Try to work the same odd number of sts across both short edges, and the same odd number of sts across both long edges.

Rnd 1: Join yarn with sl st in any corner, ch 1 (does not count as a st), (hdc, sc) in same corner, *work an odd number of sc as evenly spaced as possible to next corner, (sc, hdc, sc) in corner; rep from * twice; work an odd number of sc as evenly spaced as possible to end of rnd, sc again in first corner; join with sl st in first hdc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, sc) in same st as joining, *(ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st) to next (sc, hdc, sc) corner, ch 1, sk next sc, (sc, hdc, sc) in corner hdc; rep from * twice, (ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st) to last st, ch 1, sk last st; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 3: Sl st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sl st, ch 1, sc) in first ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * around, working (sc, hdc, sc) in each corner hdc.

Fasten off.

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Following Assembly Diagram, sew 6 buttons to each long edge of piece. Space the buttons evenly over the first 12 in. (30.5 cm) of opposite ends of the two long edges.

Weave in ends.

For sleeved Shrug, fold piece in half lengthwise then button C through A, and D through B.

For Vest, drape piece around your neck then button D through A.

For Cowl, wrap piece around your neck, twisting and buttoning as desired.
