

Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand® Heartland® Happy Granny Stripe Afghan Pattern Number: L40039

SKILL LEVEL - Easy

<u>SIZE</u>

About 39 x 53 in. (99 x 134.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Heartland (Art. #136)
 - 153 Black Canyon 1ball (A)
 - 113 Redwood 1 ball (B)
 - 135 Yosemite 1 ball (C)
 - 158 Yellowstone 1 ball (D)
 - 174 Joshua Tree 1 ball (E)
 - 109 Olympic 1 ball (F)
 - 147 Hot Springs 1 ball (G)
- Lion Brand[®] crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

<u>GAUGE</u>

 $\overline{3 \ 1/2}$ (3 dc, ch 1) groups + 6 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

rev sc (reverse single crochet) Single crochet worked from left to right (right to left, if left-handed). Insert hook into next stitch to the right (left), under loop on hook, and draw up a loop. Yarn over, draw through all loops on hook.

STRIPE SEQUENCE

Work 2 rows with A, *2 rows with B, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D, 2 rows with E, 2 rows with F, 2 rows with G; rep from * 5 more times, then work 2 rows with B and 2 rows with A - 78 rows total.

NOTES

- 1. Afghan is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows, changing color every 2 rows following Stripe Sequence.
- 2. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

<u>AFGHAN</u>

With A, ch 131.

Row 1: With A, 3 dc in 7th ch from hook (skipped chs count as dc, ch 1), ch 1, *sk 3 ch, 3 dc in next ch, ch 1; rep from * to last 4 ch, sk 3 ch, dc in last ch - 32 3-dc groups.

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Row 2: With A, ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, 2 dc in ch-1sp, ch 1 * sk 3 dc, 3 dc in ch-1sp, ch1; rep from * to last ch-sp, 3 dc in last ch-sp.

Row 3: With B, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), *sk 3 dc, 3 dc in next ch-1sp, ch1; rep from * to last dc, dc in top of beg ch-3.

Row 4: With B, Rep Row 2.

Rep Rows 3 and 4, changing color following Stripe Sequence until all 78 rows have been completed.

DO NOT fasten off.

FINISHING

Edging

Note: Edging on long sides of Afghan is worked in sps that were created by turning chs or (ch 1, dc) on each row.

Left edge

Turn Afghan, ready to work across long side.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 4 (counts as first dc, ch 1), *sk end of 1 row, 3 dc in ch-sp at end of next row, ch 1; rep from * to last row, 3 dc in ch-sp at end of last row – 39 3-dc groups.

Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as first dc, ch 1), *sk 3 dc, 3 dc in next ch-sp, ch 1; rep from * to last ch-sp, 3 dc in last ch-sp.

Fasten off.

Right edge

From RS, join A with a sl st in corner ch-sp at beg of Row 1, ready to work across opposite long side of Afghan.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in same sp, ch 1, *sk end of next row, 3 dc in ch-sp at end of next row, ch 1; rep from * to the last row, dc in top of last dc – 39 3-dc groups.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, *sk 3 dc, 3 dc in ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from * to last 3-dc group, sk 2 dc, dc in top of beg ch-3. DO NOT fasten off.

Border

Rnd 1: Sc in each st around, working ch 1 at each corner; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Rev sc in each st around, working ch 1 at each corner; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

ch = chain ch-sp(s) = chain space(s) previously made dc = double crochet rep = repeat rnd = round RS = right side sc = single crochet sk = skip sp(s) = space(s) st(s) = stitch(es) WS = wrong side
