SKILL LEVEL - Easy+

SIZE

Finished Circumference (at neck) About 26 1/2 in. (67.5 cm), untied Finished Circumference (at lower edge) About 72 in (183 cm) Finished Length About 13 1/2 in. (34.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® (Art. #860)
 - 107 Sapphire 3 balls
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

5 pattern reps = about 3 in. (7.5 cm). **Note:**

One pattern rep consists of one st (dc or sc) and the following ch-1 sp of Rows 1 and 2.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES

- 1. Shawl is worked back and forth in rows, beginning at neck.
- 2. To shape shawl, shorter ch-sps are worked between sts near neck edge and longer ch-sps are worked between sts near lower edge.

<u>SHAWL</u>

Ch 92.

Row 1 (RS): Working in back bars of foundation ch, dc in 6th ch from hook (5 skipped ch count as 1 base ch, first dc, and first ch-1 sp), *ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch; rep from * across – you will have 45 dc and 44 ch-1 sps at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, *ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next dc; rep from * to turning ch-sp, ch 1, sk next ch of turning ch, sc in next ch of turning ch – 45 sc and 44 ch-1 sps.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first sc, *sk next ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc; rep from * across – 90 sc and 45 ch-2 sps.

Rows 4-7: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in each ch-2 sp across.

Rows 8-13: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc, 45 ch-2 sps, and 44 ch-1 sps.

Rows 14-19: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 2, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc and 89 ch-2 sps.

Row 20: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc, 45 ch-2 sps, and 44 ch-3 sps.

Rows 21-26: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc, 45 ch-2 sps, and 44 ch-3 sps. **Row 27:** Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 4, sk next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc, 45 ch-2 sps, and 44 ch-4 sps. Rows 28-30: Ch 1, turn, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2 sp, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from * across – 90 sc, 45 ch-2 sps, and 44 ch-4 sps. Border (RS): Turn, sl st in first ch-2 sp, ch 3 (counts as dc), (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-4 sp, *ch 1, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-4 sp; rep from * to last ch-2 sp, ch 1, (2 dc, ch 2, dc, ch 3, sl st) in last ch-2 sp; working in ends of rows across edge, (ch 3, sk end of next row, sl st in end of next row) 14 times, ch 3; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in ch at base of first dc, **ch 2, sk next ch, sl st in ch at base of next dc; rep from ** to turning ch-sp, ch 2, sk next ch, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in next ch; working in ends of rows across edge, ch 3, sl st in end of Row 2, (ch 3, sk next row, sl st in end of next row) 14 times. Fasten off.

TIE

With 2 strands of yarn held together and leaving a 6 in. (15 cm) long beginning yarn tail, make a ch about 76 in. (193 cm) long.

Fasten off, leaving a 6 in. (15 cm) long ending yarn tail.

Weave chain through sps between sts at neck of Shawl.

Tassel

Cut three 12 in. (30.5 cm) long strands of yarn. Hold strands together and knot at center to one end of chain – you'll have 8 strands of yarn extending from end of chain. Trim yarn ends to about 2 in. (5 cm).

Rep on opposite end of chain.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
