SKILL LEVEL – Easy+

SIZE

About 11 1/2 x 42 in. (29 x 106.5 cm), after lacing

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Scarfie (Art. #826)
 - 200 Taupe/Charcoal 2 balls
 - or color of your choice
- Lion Brand® knitting needles size 9 (5.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size I-9 (5.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

14 sts + 24 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row).
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

NOTES

1. Scarf is made in one piece.
2. Yarn over (yo) eyelets are worked along one edge of Scarf.
3. Scarf is folded in half, then laced together.

SCARF

With knitting needles, cast on 2 sts.

Shape Scarf

Row 1 (WS): Knit.

Row 2 (Increase Row – RS): K1, yo, k1 – you will have 3 sts.
Place a marker in the yarn over (yo) eyelet of Row 2.

Rows 3-15: Work in Garter st (k every row).

Row 16 (Increase Row – RS): K1, yo, k to end of row – 4 sts.

Rows 17-29: Work in Garter st.

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Rep Rows 16-29 until you have 39 sts on your needle, end with a Row 29 as the last row you work. **Note:** There will be a total of 37 eyelets evenly spaced along one side edge of piece.

Mesh Section

Row 1 (Eyelet Row – RS): K1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to end of row.

Place a marker in the first eyelet of Row 1.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3 (Eyelet Row): *K2tog, yo; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 4: Knit.

Rows 5-8: Rep Rows 1-4.

Rows 9 and 10: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Bind off.

Cord

With crochet hook, make a chain about 90 in. (228.5 cm) long.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

1. Lay Scarf onto a flat surface and fold, following diagram.
2. Mark center of cord and draw cord through marked eyelets until center of cord is even with the marked eyelets. Remove markers.
3. Match eyelets along both edges of folded Scarf. You'll be lacing through the matching sets of eyelets towards folded end of Scarf.
4. Following diagram, lace eyelets together, leaving the last 5 pairs of eyelets unlaced.
5. Knot the ends of the cord, then tie into a bow.
6. To wear Scarf as a cowl, thread end of Scarf through opening at unlaced eyelets.

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

beg = begin(ning)

k = knit

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

rep = repeat

RS = right side

st(s) = stitch(es)

WS = wrong side
