

Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand® Hometown USA® Lapghan With Pockets Pattern Number: L50097

SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZE

About 25 x 38 in. (63.5 x 96.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Hometown USA (Art. #135)
 - 173 Savannah Sage 5 balls (A)
 - 172 Oklahoma City Green 1 ball (B)
 - or colors of your choice
- Lion Brand® circular knitting needle size 13 (9 mm), 29 in. (73.5 cm) long
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

9 stitches = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Stockinette stitch (knit on right side, purl on wrong side).
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES

- 1. The Lapghan is worked in one piece in Stockinette stitch with Garter stitch (knit every row) borders.
- 2. Two Pockets are worked separately in Garter stitch, then sewn to Lapghan.
- A circular needle is used to accommodate the number of stitches on the Lapghan. Work back and forth on the circular needle just as if working on straight needles.

LAPGHAN

With A, cast on 56 stitches.

Knit 5 rows to make the beginning Garter stitch border.

Row 1 (wrong side): Knit 3 for the side border, purl across to the last 3 stitches for Stockinette stitch center section, knit the last 3 stitches for the side border. **Row 2:** Knit.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until the piece measures about 37 in. (94 cm) from the beginning, ending with a Row 2 as the last row you work.

Knit 4 rows for the ending border. Bind off.

POCKETS (make 2)

With B, cast on 18 stitches. Knit 40 rows. Bind off.

FINISHING

Place a Pocket centered on the Lapghan, with the lower edge of the Pocket just inside the beginning Garter stitch border. Sew the lower and side edges of the Pocket to the Lapghan, leaving the top edge of the Pocket open. Sew the second Pocket to the opposite end of the Lapghan, with the lower edge of the Pocket just inside the ending Garter stitch border of the Lapghan.

Weave in ends.
