SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZES

Scarf

About 8 x 58 in. (20.5 x 147 cm)

Hat

Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

Finished Height About 11 in. (28 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Wool-Ease® Thick & Quick® (Art. #640)
 - 135 Spice 1 ball (A)
 - 149 Charcoal 1 ball (B)
 - 105 Glacier 1 ball (C)
 - 114 Denim 1 ball (D)
 - or colors of your choice
- Lion Brand® knitting needles size 13 (9 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Double pointed knitting needles size 11 (8 mm), set of 5

Double pointed knitting needles size 13 (9 mm), set of 5

GAUGE

9 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) with straight needles over Rows 1-10 of Scarf.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES

1. Scarf is worked in one piece on straight needles in a super simple stitch pattern.
2. Hat is worked in one piece in the round on double pointed needles, in alternating rnds of St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) and Garter st worked in rnds (knit 1 rnd, purl 1 rnd), with a k2, p2 edge.
3. Yarn colors are changed on both Hat and Scarf to make stripes.

SCARF

With straight needles and A, cast on 18 sts.

Knit 2 rows for Garter st (k every row) border.

Row 1 (right side): Knit.

Row 2: K2 (for Garter st border), p to last 2 sts, k2 (for Garter st border).

Rows 3 and 4: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Change to B.

Rows 5-8: With B, knit.

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Change to C.

Rows 9 and 10: With C, rep Rows 1 and 2.

Change to B.

Rows 11-14: With B, knit.

Change to C.

Rows 15-20: With C, rep Rows 1 and 2.

Change to D.

Rows 21-24: With D, knit.

Change to A.

Rows 25 and 26: With A, rep Rows 1 and 2.

Change to D.

Rows 27-30: With D, knit.

Change to A.

Rows 31-36: With A, rep Rows 1 and 2.

Rep Rows 5-36 five more times, then rep Rows 5-35 once more.

With A, knit 2 rows for Garter st border.

Bind off.

HAT

Note: When working in the rnd, a special (but simple) technique is used to prevent a noticeable 'jog' when the color is changed. We suggest that you try this technique on the Hat!

To prevent the jog, at the end of the first rnd with the new color, remove the end of rnd marker, and slip the next st (the first st you worked with the new color), then replace the marker. The end of rnd has now moved over by 1 st.

With smaller double pointed needles and A, cast on 44 sts. Divide sts onto 4 needles, with 11 sts on each needle. Place marker for beginning of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

Rnd 1: *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rnds 2-6: Rep Rnd 1.

Note: When working Rnd 7, change to larger double pointed needles.

Change to B.

Rnds 7-10: With B, work in Garter st worked in rnds (k 1 rnd, p 1 rnd).

Change to C.

Rnds 11 and 12: With C, work in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd).

Change to B.

Rnds 13-16: With B, rep Rnds 7-10.

Change to C.

Rnds 17-22: With C, rep Rnds 11 and 12.

Change to D.

Rnds 23-26: With D, rep Rnds 7-10.

Change to A.

Rnds 27 and 28: With A, rep Rnds 11 and 12.

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Change to D.

Rnds 29-32: With D, rep Rnds 7-10.

Change to A.

Rnds 33-38: With A, rep Rnds 11 and 12.

Change to B.

Rnds 39-42: With B, rep Rnds 7-10.

Last Rnd: With B, k2tog around – you will have 22 sts remaining.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through remaining sts and pull to gather. Knot securely.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

p = purl

rep = repeat

rnd(s) = round(s)

St st = Stockinette stitch

st(s) = stitch(es)
