SKILL LEVEL – Beginner

SIZE

About 3 1/2 in. (9 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® DIYarn (Art. #205)
 - 149 Grey 1 ball (A)
 - 150 Charcoal 1 ball (B)
 - 157 Yellow 1 ball (C)
 - 172 Grass 1 ball (D)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Cardboard square 4 x 4 in. (10 x 10 cm)

Craft glue

NOTES

1. Birdies are not meant to be toys – do not allow small children to play with the Birdies.
2. Change the yarn colors in the pattern to make the Birdies your own.
3. Yarn amounts are sufficient to make multiple Birdies.

BIRDIES

Instructions are for the Birdie with the gray head. Changes for the Birdie with the yellow head are given in parentheses.

Body

Wrap A (C) yarn around the cardboard square about 30 times. Thread blunt needle with a strand of A (C) yarn. Draw threaded needle under yarn wraps at top edge of cardboard. Pull strand tightly and knot securely. Cut yarn wraps at bottom edge of cardboard.

Head

Wrap B (D) yarn around cardboard about 25 times, then make head same as body.

Lay head on top of body and tie together at center.

Fold B (D) strands to one side (so only B (D) shows on this side, then tie all A and B (C and D) strands together about 1 in. (2.5 cm) from ends.

Wings

Hold C and D (A and B) together and wrap around the cardboard about 15 times, then make wings same as body.

Draw wings through body.

With a strand of D (B), tie all strands together about 1 in. (2.5 cm) from ends.

FINISHING

Trim yarn ends evenly.

Beak

Cut a small triangle from cardboard, fold in half and glue to Birdie for beak.
