SIZE

Finished Size

About 4-6 in. (10-15 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® DIYarn (Art. #205)
 - 101 Pink 1 ball
 - 133 Orange 1 ball
 - 146 Lilac 1 ball
 - 102 Aqua 1 ball
 - 157 Yellow 1 ball



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Craft sticks – you'll need 2 for each butterfly

Chenille stems – 1 for each butterfly

Glue on acrylic jewels – 1 for each butterfly

Small buttons – 4 for each butterfly

Crafted Glue

NOTES

1. Yarn amounts are sufficient to make 15 or more Butterflies.
2. General instructions for Butterflies are given. Choose colors as desired and get creative!

BUTTERFLIES

Body and Wings

Glue 2 craft sticks together in an X shape to make body and wings.

Glue one end of yarn color as desired to center of X.

Working from center of X, wrap sticks with yarn, leaving the ends of the sticks unwrapped. Wrap back to center to make a second layer of yarn. Wrap other side of sticks in the same way.

Trim end of yarn and glue to wraps.

Antenna and Eyes

Wrap center of body with a chenille stem, leaving about 2 in. (5 cm) on each end of stem free.

Twist ends of stem together to make antenna.

Stack 2 buttons for each eye. Thread chenille stem up through one hole in both buttons and down through the second hole. Slide buttons down to body and bend ends of antenna slightly.
