SIZE

Finished Size

About 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 in. (14 x 21.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® DIYarn (Art. #205)
 - 184 Peach 1 ball
 - 102 Aqua 1 ball
 - 195 Hot Pink 1 ball
 - 172 Grass 1 ball
 - 133 Orange 1 ball



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

8 1/2 x 11 in. (21.5 x 28 cm) sheets of card stock – one each in ivory, light pink and orange

Scrap paper

Glue on acrylic flowers and assorted jewels

Craft glue

NOTES

1. Use our pattern as inspiration, then change yarn colors and trims to make the card your own.
2. Always allow glue to dry before moving on to the next step in the instructions.
3. Yarn amounts are sufficient to make multiple cards.

Flower Girl Card

Fold the ivory card stock in half to make a 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 in. (14 x 21.5 cm) folded card.

Draw or trace the outline of a girl wearing a dress onto scrap paper. You can print an image that you find online or draw your own!

Using the scrap paper drawing as a template, cut the girl from pink card stock and the girl's dress from orange card stock.

FINISHING

Glue girl onto folded card, then glue dress onto girl.

Cut short lengths of yarn in colors as desired and glue onto dress to make stripes and onto girl's head to make hair.

Glue sequins onto dress for buttons. Cut sequins in half and glue onto girl for eyes and mouth.

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Glue lengths of green yarn onto card for bouquet. Glue an acrylic flower at the tops of the strands and a yarn bow near the base of the strands.
