SKILL LEVEL – Beginner

SIZE

Finished Size

About 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 in. (14 x 21.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® DIYarn (Art. #205)
 - 113 Red 1 ball (A)
 - 130 Green 1 ball (B)



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

2 sheets of 8 1/2 x 11 in. (21.5 x 28 cm)

green card stock

Glue on acrylic stars and assorted jewels

Craft glue

NOTES

1. Use our pattern as inspiration, then change yarn colors and trims to make the card your own.
2. Always allow glue to dry before moving on to the next step in the instructions.

CARD

Front

Cut one piece of card stock in half to make 2 pieces, each 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 in. (14 x 21.5 cm).

Set one half of cut card stock aside. Cut a 4 1/2 x 6 in. (11.5 x 15 cm) tree shape from the other half.

Glue one end of a strand of A yarn to the back of the tree shape. Wrap the yarn around the tree to make a garland, adding small amounts of glue as needed. Cut yarn and glue end of strand to back of tree.

Glue acrylic stars and jewels to tree as desired.

Glue one end of B yarn to the back of the remaining half of cut card stock, then wrap sheet (working across the 5 1/2 in. (14 cm) width of piece) completely with B yarn. When piece is completely wrapped, cut yarn and glue yarn end to back of card.

Center the trimmed tree onto the wrapped card and glue in place.

Fold remaining piece of card stock in half to make a 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 in. (14 x 21.5 cm) folded card.
