Rustic Dreamcatcher

SKILL LEVEL – Beginner

SIZE

Finished Size

About 9 1/2 in. (24 cm) diameter

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® DIYarn (Art. #205)
 - 102 Aqua 1 ball (A)
 - 126 Brown 1 ball (B)
 - 100 White 1 ball (C)
 - 133 Orange 1 ball (D)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Purchased artificial branch, about 36 in.

(91.5 cm) long (check to be sure the branch is flexible)

Assorted wooden beads with holes large enough to be strung onto the yarn

Purchased feathers

Craft glue

NOTES

1. Materials are sufficient to make multiple Dreamcatchers.
2. Pattern provides general directions – use these directions as a starting point, then make the Dreamcatchers your own by choosing yarns and trims as desired!

DREAMCATCHER

Make Ring

Cut a 12 in. (30.5 cm) strand of yarn A and thread into the blunt needle.

Bend the branch into a circle. To secure the circle shape, knot the strand of A around the overlapping ends of the branch. Cover the knot by wrapping the A strand around the branch. To finish off, draw the blunt needle through the yarn wraps to hide the end of the yarn.

First Woven Circle

Cut a 24 in. (61 cm) strand of B. Thread strand into blunt needle, then string 6-7 beads onto the yarn strand.

Knot the end of the strand to the ring and remove the blunt needle.

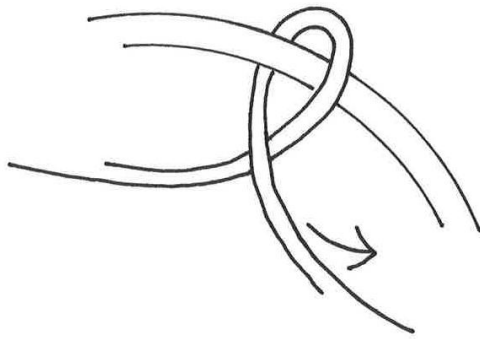
Move over about 2 in. (5 cm) to the right of the knot on the ring, then loop yarn around ring.

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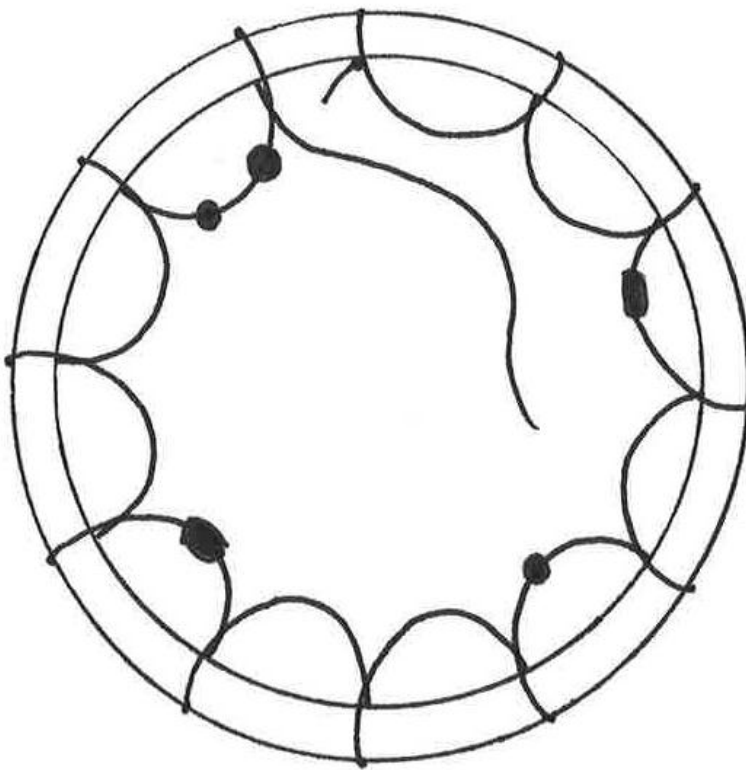
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Continue to work around the ring, making a loop around the ring every 2 in. (5 cm) or so - you needn't have a specific number of loops. As you loop yarn around the ring, slide a bead close to as many of the loops as desired.

When you've made loops all around your ring, it should look like this.



Second Woven Circle

Continue with the B strand to make the second woven circle.

Moving to the right around the ring, loop the strand of B just as you did before, but now loop it around the center of each of the yarn strands you made on the first woven circle.

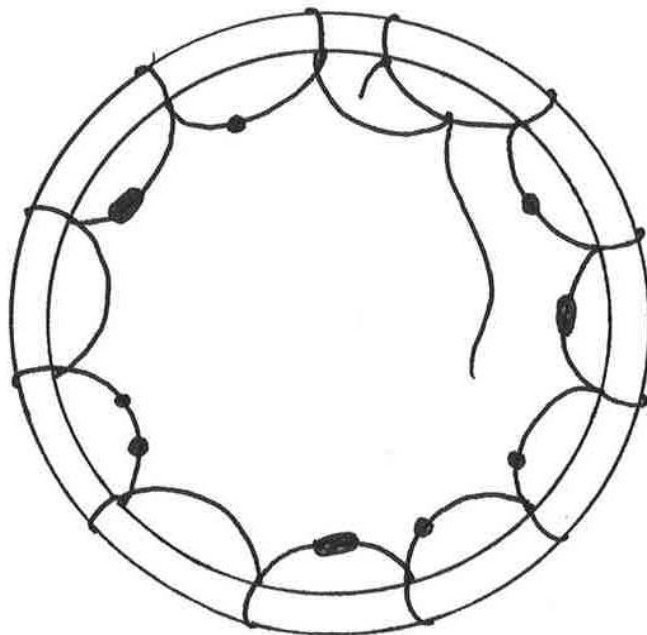
Make loops all the way around the ring, sliding up beads as desired.

When you've finished the second circle, make a third circle. End off the B yarn by knotting the strand at your last wrap. The knots will be covered later.

Prepare a strand of yarn C just as for the B strand. Knot the end of the strand at the ending knot on the third circle.

With the C strand, continue to weave around the ring in smaller and smaller circles, adding beads as desired, until just the center of the ring is unwoven.

Knot C at the last wrap and trim yarn end.



FINISHING

To cover knots

Thread a short length of yarn A, D, or yarn color as desired, into the blunt needle. Wrap yarn around each knot, then draw needle under wraps to hide the end of the yarn.

Attach feather

Cut a 12 in. (30.5 cm) strand of yarn A, D, or yarn color as desired and thread into the blunt needle.

Wrap yarn around end of feather, then knot. Wrap end of yarn around a woven strand on the Dreamcatcher to secure the feather, then knot.

Apply a very small amount of craft glue to any stray yarn ends and glue them to the back of the Dreamcatcher.
