## **SKILL LEVEL – Easy+**

### **SIZES**

#### **Poncho**

Child's 4-6 years (8-10 years, 12 years)

**Finished Width** About 20 1/2 (23 1/2, 25 1/2) in. (52 (59.5, 65) cm)

**Finished Length** About 17 (22, 25 1/2) in. (43 (56, 65) cm)

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

#### **Cowl**

**Finished Circumference** About 24 in. (61 cm)

### **MATERIALS**

- Lion Brand® Jeans® (Art. #505)
  - 109 Stonewash 3 (5, 6) balls (A)
  - 121 Top Stitch 1 (2, 2) ball(s) (B)
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



### **GAUGE**

16 sts + 13 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 3-6 of Poncho.  
**BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**

### **STITCH EXPLANATIONS**

**dc2tog (dc 2 sts together)** (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

**rev sc (reverse single crochet)** Single crochet worked from left to right (right to left, if left-handed). Insert hook into next stitch to the right (left), under loop on hook, and draw up a loop. Yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

**sc2tog (sc 2 sts together)** (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

### **NOTES**

1. Poncho is worked in 2 pieces, Back and Front, then sewn together.
2. The neckband and edging are worked onto the completed Poncho.
3. The Cowl is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows, then sewn together to make a ring.
4. An edging is worked onto the completed Cowl.
5. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed

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with new color. Drop old color but do not fasten off. Pick up old color when needed for next color change.

6. For those who find visuals helpful, we have included stitch diagrams.

## **PONCHO**

### **BACK**

With A, ch 81 (93, 101).

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 80 (92, 100) sc.

**Row 2:** With A, ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in each st across changing to B in last st.

Drop A, but do NOT fasten off.

**Row 3:** With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first st, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* to beg ch-3, sc in top of beg ch-3 – 41 (47, 51) sc and 39 (45, 49) ch-1 sps.

**Row 4:** With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first st, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to last st, sc in last st, changing to A in last st.

Drop B but do not fasten off.

**Row 5:** With A, ch 1, turn, sc in each st and ch-1 sp across – 80 (92, 100) sc.

**Row 6:** Rep Row 2.

**Rows 7-14:** Rep Rows 3-6 twice.

**Rows 15 and 16:** Rep Rows 3 and 4. Place a marker in each end of Row 16. Fasten off B.

Work remainder of Back with A only.

**Rows 17 and 18:** Rep Rows 5 and 6. Do not change to B at end of Row 18.

**Rows 19-54 (70, 82):** With A, rep Rows 3-6 for 9 (13, 16) more times.

**Last Row:** With A, rep Row 3.

Fasten off A.

### **FRONT**

Work same as Back until you have finished Row 50 (66, 78).

#### **Shape Left Shoulder**

**Note:** As you shape the left and right shoulders of the Front, continue to work with A only.

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, (ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st) 14 (16, 18) times, sc in next st; leave rem sts unworked for front neck and right shoulder – 16 (18, 20) sc and 14 (16, 18) ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to last st, sc in last st – 16 (18, 20) sc and 13 (15, 17) ch-1 sps

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc and ch-1 sp across to last 3 sts, sc2tog, sc in last st – 28 (32, 36) sc.

**Row 4:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, dc2tog, dc in each st across – 27 (31, 35) dc.

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**Row 5:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* to last 2 sts, sk next st, sc in top of beg ch-3 – 14 (16, 18) sc and 12 (14, 16) ch-1 sps.  
Fasten off.

### Shape Right Shoulder

**Row 1:** From RS, sk next 20 (24, 24) unworked sts of Row 50 (66, 78) following left shoulder, draw up a loop of A in next st, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next st, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* across – 16 (18, 20) sc and 14 (16, 18) ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* last 2 sts, sc2tog – 16 (18, 20) sc and 13 (15, 17) ch-1 sps.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sc2tog, sc in each sc and ch-1 sp across – 28 (32, 36) sc.

**Row 4:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, dc in each st to last 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in last st – 27 (31, 35) dc.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sk next st, sc in next st, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* across working last sc in top of beg ch-3 – 14 (16, 18) sc and 12 (14, 16) ch-1 sps.  
Fasten off.

### **FINISHING**

Sew shoulder seams.

### Neckband

**Note:** Neckband is worked in joined rounds with RS always facing.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** From RS, join A with sl st in neck edge at shoulder seam so that you are ready to work along the front neck edge.

Work 34 (38, 38) sc evenly spaced along front neck edge and 28 (32, 32) sc evenly spaced along back neck edge; join with sl st in first sc – 62 (70, 70) sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in same st as join, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* to last st, ch 1, sk last st; join with sl st in first sc – 31 (35, 35) sc and 31 (35, 35) ch-1 sps.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, rev sc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next sc, rev sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to last sc, ch 1, sk last sc; join with sl st in beg ch-1.

Fasten off.

### Outside Edging

**Rnd 1 (RS):** From RS, join B with a sl st at marker on Front so that you are ready to work towards lower edge of Poncho.

Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced along edge to next marker; change to A, sc evenly spaced up side edge of Front to shoulder then down side edge of Back to next marker; change to B, sc evenly spaced along edge to next marker; change to A, sc evenly spaced to end of rnd, changing to B in last st; join with sl st in first sc.

**Note:** Rnd 2 calls for an even number of sts. If you don't have an even number of sts at the end of Rnd 1, just skip an extra st or two when working Rnd 2 so that you can end Rnd 2 evenly.

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When working Rnds 2 and 3, use B in the B-colored sts and A in the A-colored sts.

**Rnd 2:** Beg with B, ch 1, sc in same st as join, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st; rep from \* around, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each corner ch-1 sp, to last sc, ch 1, sk last sc; join with sl st in first sc.

**Rnd 3:** Beg with A, ch 1, work rev sc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next sc, rev sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* to last sc, ch 1, sk last sc; join with sl st in beg ch-1.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

## **COWL**

With A, ch 42.

**Row 1:** Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), \*ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch; rep from \* across – you will have 21 dc and 19 ch-1 sps.

**Rows 2-46:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, dc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

## **Joining Row**

Holding ends of Cowl together, join first row to last by working sc evenly spaced through both layers.

Fasten off.

## **Cords (make 3)**

With 2 strands of B held tog, make a chain about 20 in. (51 cm) long.

Fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

### **Edging**

Join B with a sl st on edge of Cowl at seam.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc in same sp, working in ends of rows along edge, \*ch 2, sk end of next row, sc in end of next row; rep from \* to end of last row, ch 2; join with sl st in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** \*Ch 2, rev sc in next ch-sp; rep from \* around; join with sl st in base of beg ch-2.

Fasten off.

Rep edging along opposite edge of Cowl.

Weave in yarn ends.

Place 3 markers on one long edge of Cowl, about 8 in. (20.5 cm) apart – this divides the Cowl into 3 equal sections.

At each marker, weave a Cord in and out of ch-sps across width of Cowl to opposite edge, then weave back again along ch-sps of adjoining row.

Pull ends of each Cord to gather Cowl slightly, then tie Cord ends into a bow.
