## **SKILL LEVEL** – Easy

### **SIZE**

**Finished Circumference** About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

### **MATERIALS**

- Lion Brand® Wool-Ease® (Art. #620)
  - 151 Grey Heather 1 ball (A)
  - 152 Oxford Grey 1 ball (B)
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- Lion Brand® Pom Pom Maker
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



### **ADDITIONAL MATERIALS**

4 small buttons  
Sewing needle and thread

### **GAUGE**

15 dc + 7 rnds = about 4 in. (10 cm).  
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

### **STITCH EXPLANATIONS**

**BPHDC (Back Post half double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from back to front then to back again, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook. Skip st behind the BPHDC.

**FPHDC (Front Post half double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook. Skip st behind the FPHDC.

**FPDC (front post double crochet)** Yarn over, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Skip st behind the FPDC.

### **NOTES**

1. Hat is worked in one piece in the round with the right side always facing, beginning at top.
2. The pom pom is tied to completed Hat.
3. Buttons are decorative only.
4. When you see "– 12 sts" in the instructions, this lets you know how many sts you will have at the end of that specific row.

## **HAT**

With A, ch 4; join with sl st to form a ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 2 (does not count as a st in this rnd and all following rnds), work 11 dc in ring; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, (dc, FPDC) in each st around (first work the dc, then work the FPDC around the same st); join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 22 sts.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 2, \*(FPDC, dc) in next st (first work the FPDC, then work the dc behind it), (dc, FPDC) in next st (first work the dc, then work the FPDC around the same st); rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 44 sts.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 2, \*sk next FPDC, (FPDC, dc) in next dc, (dc, FPDC) in next dc, sk next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 2, \*sk next FPDC, (FPDC, 2 dc) in next dc, (2 dc, FPDC) in next dc, sk next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 66 sts.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 2, \*sk next FPDC, (FPDC, 2 dc) in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (2 dc, FPDC) in next dc, sk next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 88 sts.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 2, \*sk next FPDC, sk next dc, (FPDC, 2 dc) in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (2 dc, FPDC) in next dc, sk next dc, sk next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 88 sts.

Rep Rnd 7 until Hat measures about 7 1/2 in. (19 cm) from beginning.

**Next Rnd (Decrease Rnd):** Ch 2, \*sk next FPDC, sk next dc, (FPDC, dc) in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, FPDC) in next dc, sk next dc, sk next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 66 sts.

Do NOT fasten off.

## **Band**

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, \*FPHDC in next FPDC, BPHDC in next dc, FPHDC in next 2 dc, BPHDC in next dc, FPHDC in next FPDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st to beg ch - 66 sts.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, \*FPHDC, BPHDC, (FPHDC) twice, BPHDC, FPHDC; rep from \* around; join with sl st to beg ch.

**Rnds 3-10:** Rep Rnd 2 for 7 more times.

Fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.

With B and following package instructions, make a pom pom. Tie pom pom to top of Hat.

With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to band.

sl st = slip stitch  
st(s) = stitch(es)
