

Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® Bonbons® Pom Pom Knit Hat

SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZE

Finished Circumference About 18 (20 1/2) in. (45.5 (52) cm), Hat will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

Finished Height About 11 in. (28 cm)

Note: Pattern is written for smaller size with changes for larger size in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® (Art. #860)
 - 153 Black 1 ball (A)
- Lion Brand® Bonbons® (Art. #601)
 - 680 Crayons 1 package (B)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® Pom-pom Maker
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 9 (5.5 mm), 16 in. (40.5 cm) long

GAUGE

16 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st worked in the rnd (knit every rnd). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES

- 1. Hat is knit in one piece in the round on a circular needle.
- 2. Pom-poms are tied onto the finished Hat.
- 3. Pom-poms can be attached to a purchased knit hat if you prefer!

HAT

With A, cast on 72 (82) sts.

Place marker for beginning of rnd and join by knitting the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist.

Work in St st worked in the rnd (knit every rnd) until piece measures about 11 1/2 in. (29 cm) from beg.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail into blunt needle, then draw through sts on needle and pull to close top of Hat. Knot securely.

Weave in ends.

FINISHING

Pom-poms

With yarn colors in B yarn package, make 24 pom-poms in small and medium sizes as desired. On each Pom-pom, leave long ends on the tying yarn. Using yarn ends, tie Pom-poms onto Hat as desired.

ABBREVIATIONS

rnd = round
st(s) = stitch(es)
St st = Stockinette stitch
