

# Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand® Ice Cream® Big Scoop® Carroll Gardens Hooded Cardigan

# **SKILL LEVEL** – Easy

#### SIZES

1 year (2-3 years, 4 years)

Finished Chest About 21 1/2 (23, 25) in. (54.5 (58.5, 63.5) cm)

Finished Length About 10 (11, 12 1/2) in. (25.5 (28, 32) cm)

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

#### **MATERIALS**

- Lion Brand® Ice Cream® Big Scoop® (Art. #922)
  - 208 Mint 1 (1, 2) ball(s)
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size F-5 (3.75 mm)
- Lion Brand® Pom-Pom Maker
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



2 buttons, about 1/2 in. (13 mm) diameter Sewing needle and thread

#### **GAUGE**

17 dc + 10 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

# **STITCH EXPLANATION**

**rev sc (reverse single crochet)** Single crochet worked from left to right (right to left, if left-handed). Insert hook into next stitch to the right (left), under loop on hook, and draw up a loop. Yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

# **NOTES**

- Body of Cardigan is crocheted in one piece beginning at the lower edge.
- 2. At armholes, the piece is divided and the fronts and back are worked separately.
- The Sleeves and Hood are crocheted separately and sewn to the Body.

#### **BODY**

Ch 92 (99, 107).

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 91 (98, 106) sts.

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across.

Rows 3-13 (13, 15): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

# Divide for Fronts and Back Left Front

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Row 1 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in next 22 (24, 27) dc; leave rem sts unworked for back and right front – 23 (25, 28) dc.

Rows 2-10 (12, 14): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

## Shape Neck

Row 1 (WS): Turn, sl st in first 12 (13, 15) sts, ch 3 (counts as dc), sk next dc, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3 – 11 (12, 13) dc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

#### Back

From WS, join yarn with a sl st in first unworked st of Body following left front.

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 44 (47, 49) dc; leave rem sts unworked for right front – 45 (48, 50) dc.

Rows 2-12 (14, 16): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

#### **Right Front**

From WS, join yarn with a sl st in first unworked st of Body following back.

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in each dc across working last dc in top of beg ch-3 – 23 (25, 28) dc.

Rows 2-10 (12, 14): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

#### **Shape Neck**

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in next 10 (11, 12) dc; leave rem sts unworked for right front neck – 11 (12, 13) dc.

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

#### SLEEVES (make 2)

Ch 25 (27, 29).

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 24 (26, 28) sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across.

Row 3 (Increase Row): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, dc in first st (increase made), dc in each st to 1 dc before beg ch, 2 dc in last dc, dc in top of beg ch-3 - 26 (28, 30) sts.

# Size 1 year ONLY

**Row 4:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Rows 5-18: Rep Rows 3 and 4 for 7 more times – 40 dc in Row 18.

Fasten off.

Proceed to Hood.

# Sizes 2-3 years (4 years) ONLY

**Rows 4-12 (14):** Rep Row 3 for 9 (11) more times – 46 (52) sts in last row worked.

**Next 7 (6) Rows:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

Proceed to Hood.

#### HOOD

Ch 69 (73, 77).

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 68 (72, 76) sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across.

**Row 3:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each st across working last dc in top of beg ch-3.

Rep Row 3 until piece measures about 6 1/2 (7, 8) in. (16.5 (18, 20.5) cm) from beg.

Fasten off.

# **FINISHING**

Sew shoulder seams. Sew Sleeve seams then sew Sleeves into armholes. Following diagram, fold Hood in half, then sew edges together for back seam. Sew Hood to neck edge of Cardigan.

#### Edging

From RS, join yarn with a sl st anywhere in lower edge of Cardigan.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced all the way around outer edges of Body and Hood; join with sl st in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, rev sc in same st as join, \*ch 1, sk next st, rev sc in next st; rep from \* around without skipping sts at corners, ch 1; join with sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

## Sleeve Edging

From RS, working along opposite side of foundation ch, join yarn with a sl st in any ch at edge of Sleeve.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 1, rev sc in same st as join, \*ch 1, sk next ch, rev sc in next ch; rep from \* to last ch, ch 1, sk last ch; join with sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

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With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to right front, with first button about 1/4 in. (6 mm) below neck edge and second button about 1 in. (2.5 cm) below first. Use ch-1 sps in Rnd 2 of edging for buttonholes.

Following package directions, make a small pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to point of Hood.

Weave in ends.
