



Free Knitting Pattern
Lion Brand® Feels Like Butta
Two-sided Cowl
Pattern Number: L70261



SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZE

Finished Circumference About 28 in. (71 cm)

Finished Height About 8 in. (20 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Feels Like Butta (Art. #215)
 - 138 Cranberry 1 ball (A)
 - 133 Orange 1 ball (B)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 7 (4.5 mm), 24 in. (61 cm) long

GAUGE

18 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Stockinette st worked in the rnd (knit every rnd).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES

1. Cowl is worked in one piece in the round on a circular needle.
2. Cast on and bound off edges are sewn together.

COWL

With A, cast on 126 sts.

Place marker for beginning of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle, and being careful not to twist sts.

Slip the marker on each rnd as you come to it.

Row 1: Knit

Row 2: Purl

Rows 1 and 2 make a decorative ridge on the cowl.

Change to Stockinette st worked in the rnd (knit every rnd) with A. Work until piece measures about 8 in. (20.5 cm) from beginning.

With A, purl one rnd.

Change to B.

With B, knit one rnd, then purl one rnd.

Change to Stockinette st worked in the rnd with B and work until piece measures same as A section.

With B, purl one rnd.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew bound-off end of Cowl to cast-on end.

Weave in ends.

st(s) = stitch(es)
