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SKILL LEVEL – Easy+

<u>SIZE</u>

About 18 x 56 in. (45.5 x 142 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® ZZ Twist (Art. #763)
 - 149 Grey 2 balls (A)
 - 098 Ecru 1 ball (B)
 - 122 Taupe 1 ball (C)
- Lion Brand® knitting needles size 7 (4.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

<u>GAUGE</u>

22 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm), over Rows 1-10 of pattern. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

sk2p (slip-k2tog-pass slipped st over)

A double decrease worked as follows:

1. Insert right needle as if to knit, and slip the next st from the left needle to the right needle.

2. Knit the next 2 sts together.

3. With tip of left needle, lift the slipped st (the 2nd st on right needle) up and over the k2tog (first st on right needle) and off the needle – you have decreased 2 sts.

Yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates an eyelet, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

STRIPE SEQUENCE

Change yarn color to work stripes as follows:

24 rows with A 8 rows with B 14 rows with C 2 rows with B 12 rows with C 16 rows with A 8 rows with B 8 rows with A 4 rows with B

Repeat these 96 rows for Stripe Sequence.



<u>NOTES</u>

- 1. Shawl is worked in one piece, changing yarn color to make stripes.
- 2. The slip stitch at the beginning of each row should be slipped as if to purl.

SHAWL

With A, cast on 99 sts. Row 1 and all WS rows: SI 1, p to end of row. **Row 2 (RS):** SI 1, *k1, yo, k12, sk2p, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 4:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k11, sk2p, k1, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 6:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k10, sk2p, k2, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 8:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k9, sk2p, k3, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 10:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k8, sk2p, k4, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 12:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k7, sk2p, k5, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 14:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k6, sk2p, k6, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 16:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k5, sk2p, k7, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 18:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k4, sk2p, k8, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 20:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k3, sk2p, k9, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 22:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k2, sk2p, k10, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 24:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k1, sk2p, k11, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 26:** SI 1, *k1, yo, sk2p, k12, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 28:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k1, sk2p, k11, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 30:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k2, sk2p, k10, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 32:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k3, sk2p, k9, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 34:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k4, sk2p, k8, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 36:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k5, sk2p, k7, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 38:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k6, sk2p, k6, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. Row 40: Sl 1, *k1, yo, k7, sk2p, k5, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 42:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k8, sk2p, k4, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 44:** Sl 1, *k1, yo, k9, sk2p, k3, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 46:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k10, sk2p, k2, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. **Row 48:** SI 1, *k1, yo, k11, sk2p, k1, yo; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1.

Rep Rows 1-48, changing color following Stripe Sequence as established, until piece measures about 56 in. (142 cm) from beginning. The last row you work should be a RS row.

Next Row: With same color used on last row, sl 1, purl to end of row. From RS, bind off as if to purl.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Lay a large towel onto a flat surface. Dampen Shawl, lay onto towel, then smooth out to finished measurements.

Allow Shawl to air dry completely.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit k2tog = knit 2 stitches together p = purl rep = repeat RS = right side sl = slip st(s) = stitch(es) WS = wrong side
