

# Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand® Scarfie® Modern Garter Hat

# SKILL LEVEL – Easy

### SIZE

**Finished Circumference** About 18 in. (45.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

Finished Height About 10 1/2 in. (26.5 cm)

## **MATERIALS**

- Lion Brand® Scarfie® (Art. #826)
  - 217 Mint/Silver 1 ball
- Lion Brand® knitting needles size 13 (9 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



## **GAUGE**

11 sts + 18 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (knit every st on every row) with 2 strands of yarn held together.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

# **TECHNIQUE EXPLANATION**

#### wrap and turn

Wrap and turn is a technique used to ensure that a small hole doesn't form at the end of a short row.

- 1. Bring the yarn between the needles to the front of the work (the side of the knitting that is facing you). Take care not to wrap the yarn over your needle!
- 2. Slip the next st from the left hand needle to the right hand needle as if to purl.
- 3. Turn the work. After turning, the yarn will be in the back of the work.
- 4. Bring the yarn between the needles to the front of the work.
- 5. Slip the first st on left needle as if to purl, back onto right needle. This st will now have a wrap of yarn around the base.
- 6. Bring the yarn between the needles to the back of the work to continue knitting.

#### **NOTES**

- 1. Hat is made in one piece with 2 strands of yarn held together.
- 2. To work with 2 strands, wind the yarn into 2 separate balls before beginning. Hold a strand from each of these balls together, then knit just as you would when working with a single strand.
- 3. The Hat is shaped by working short rows. Short rows are rows that are worked over just a portion of the total sts on a row.
- 4. Because the Hat is worked in Garter st (knit every st on every row), the wrap and turn technique used on the short rows is a bit simplified. Unlike most short row instructions, you do not need to pick up and knit the wrap it will simply disappear into the Garter st.

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#### HAT

With 2 strands of yarn held together, cast on 32 sts. Knit 1 row.

- **1.** Knit to last 2 sts, wrap and turn (leaving last 2 sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **2.** Knit to last 3 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **3.** Knit to last 4 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **4.** Knit to last 5 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **5.** Knit to last 6 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **6.** Knit to last 7 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **7.** Knit to last 8 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **8.** Knit to last 9 sts, wrap and turn (leaving remaining sts unworked) and knit back to the beginning of the row.
- **9.** Knit all sts across the row.
- 10. Knit all sts across the row.

Repeat 1-10 for 3 more times.

Bind off and cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

#### **FINISHING**

Thread yarn tail into a blunt needle and sew sides of Hat together. Weave in ends.
