

Free Crochet Pattern **Lion Brand® Landscapes®** Saratoga Hat Pattern Number: L70322



SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZE

Finished Circumference About 18 in. (45.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Landscapes® (Art. #545)
 - 215 Fiesta 1 ball
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

12 sc = about 4 in. (10 cm).
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

sc2tog (single crochet 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

NOTE

Ribbed band is worked back and forth in rows, then stitches for the Hat are picked up along the band and worked in rounds.

HAT

Ribbed Band

Ch 9.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 8 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, working in front loops only, sc in each st across.

Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 18 in. (45.5 cm) from beg, unstretched. Do not fasten off.

Hat

Rnd 1 (RS): Working across one long side edge of ribbing, ch 1, work 56 sc evenly spaced across; join with sl st in first sc.

Place marker for beg of rnd; move marker up as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in next st and in each st around.

Rnd 3: Hdc in each st around.

Rep Rnd 3 until piece measures about 8 in. (20.5 cm) from beg.

Shape Crown (top of Hat)

Rnd 1: *Sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around – you will have 42 sc.

Rnd 2: *Sc in next st, sc2tog; rep from * around – 28 sc.

Rnd 3: Sc2tog around – 14 sc.

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Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail.

Thread tail into blunt needle, draw through sts of Rnd 3 and pull to gather. Knot securely.

FINISHING

Sew short ends of ribbed band together.

Weave in ends.

sc = single crochet
sl st = slip stitch
st(s) = stitch(es)
