Wrap it! Glue it! Tie it!

London's designs reflect a free-spirited, improvisational approach to yarn crafting.

London uses a slip knot and just 3 stitches in her designs – a chain stitch, a slip stitch and a single crochet stitch. Watch our how-to videos at LionBrand.com/londonkaye for how to make a slip knot and how to do each of the 3 stitches.

Remember that London's style is big loose stitches! Don't pull your yarn tightly or try for uniform, even stitches. Our diagrams show orderly stitches. Use the diagrams to plot your course, but we encourage you to go your own way and place your stitches as you like.

Our patterns are meant to inspire you to embrace your creative spirit!

HERE'S HOW

Start at the center



Step 1 With A, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 3.

Join the chain with a slip stitch to make a ring.

Terms

sc = single crochet




Step 3 Working into the stitches of Step 2, make 2 sc in each of the first 4 sc, chain 2, skip next sc of Step 2, make 2 sc in each of next 3 sc - you'll have 14 sc and 1 chain-2 space.




Step 2 Chain 1, make 8 sc into the ring.

Stitches are now worked around in a spiral.



Step 4 Chain 2, working into the stitches of Step 3, skip the first sc, make 2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in each of next 2 sc, chain 2, skip next sc, make 2 sc in next sc, 1 sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next ch, sc in next ch, 2 sc in next sc, 1 sc in each of next 2 sc, chain 3, skip next 3 sc.





Step 5 Working into the sts of Step 4, make 2 sc in the first chain space, 2 sc in the next chain space, 1 sc in next sc, chain 3, skip next 2 sc, make 1 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next sc, chain 2, skip next sc, make 1 sc in each of next 3 sc, chain 4, skip next 3 sc, make 1 sc in each of next 2 sc, 1 sc in each of next 2 chain spaces, and 2 sc in next chain space.

Continue to work in spirals of sc stitches and chains, skipping the sc stitches beneath the chains, to build an ever-widening organic circle shape. Place the stitches and the chain spaces as you like.

Change the yarn color as you go - London worked 6-7 spirals with A and then 2-3 spirals each with B, C, and D.

To change the yarn color, just fasten off the color you're no longer using and join the new yarn color with a slip stitch into your Dream Catcher.

Work in spirals until your Dream Catcher is about 22 in. (56 cm) across. Fasten off.

To finish, join E (or any color as desired) with a slip st anywhere along the outside edge of the Dream Catcher. Make sc stitches evenly spaced around the outside edge.

Join your last stitch to your first with a slip stitch, then fasten off.

Glue yarn tails to the back of the Dream Catcher.
