FLOWER CHAIN

SIZE

Each Flower measures about 5 1/2 in. (14 cm)

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® LONDON KAYE® THEME PACK (Art. #3001)
 #611 Bouquet Pack
- LION BRAND® LONDON KAYE® HOOK WITH A TWIST™ (Art. #3002)
 #301 Small (9 mm) crochet hook

YOU'LL ALSO NEED

Hot glue and glue gun

Wrap it! Glue it! Tie it!

London's designs reflect a free-spirited, improvisational approach to yarn crafting.

London uses a slip knot and just 3 stitches in her designs – a chain stitch, a slip stitch and a single crochet stitch. Watch our how-to videos at LionBrand.com/londonkaye for how to make a slip knot and how to do each of the 3 stitches.

Remember that London's style is big loose stitches! Don't pull your yarn tightly or try for uniform, even stitches. Our diagrams show orderly stitches. Use the diagrams to plot your course, but we encourage you to go your own way and place your stitches as you like.

Our patterns are meant to inspire you to embrace your creative spirit!

X single crochet

slip stitch

HERE'S HOW

Yarn amounts should be enough to make about 12 flowers.

Center Circle



Step 1 With E, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 3. Join the last chain to the first chain with a slip stitch to make a ring.

Terms

sc = single crochet

turn = turn your piece around so that the side that was facing you is now facing away from you.



Step 2 Chain 1, make 10 sc in the ring, then slip stitch in first sc to join - you'll have 10 sc. Fasten off.

Petals

Join any yarn color with a slip stitch in any sc of Step 2.



Step 3 Chain 1, *make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in the next sc; repeat from * 4 more times, then slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 15 sc.



Step 4 Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of the next 3 sc – you'll have 3 sc.

Tip Our diagrams show petals all made with the same number of rows but you may want to create more organic looking flowers by making the petals in different lengths. To change the length of the petals, simply turn your piece at the end of Step 4, then repeat Step 4 once or twice more before going on to Step 5.



Step 5 Chain 1, turn, make 1 sc in the first sc, make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in the next sc – you'll have 4 sc.




Step 6 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, slip stitch in the next sc – you'll have 2 sc.



Step 7 Chain 1, turn, make 1 sc in the next sc, slip stitch in the next sc – you'll have 1 sc.

Fasten off.



Step 8 Join the yarn that you are using for the petals with a slip stitch in the next sc of Step 2, following the petal you just finished.

Repeat Steps 4-7 to make the next petal.

Repeat Step 8 until you've made a total of 5 petals.

Glue yarn tails to the back of each Flower.

Weave a long length of any color yarn in and out through the top of each Flower to make the chain.
