MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® LONDON KAYE® THEME PACK (Art. #3001) #604 London Eye Pack
- LION BRAND® LONDON KAYE® HOOK WITH A TWIST™ (Art. #3002) #303 Large (20 mm) crochet hook

YOU'LL ALSO NEED

Hot glue and glue gun

Wrap it! Glue it! Tie it!

London's designs reflect a free–spirited, improvisational approach to yarn crafting.

London uses a slip knot and just 3 stitches in her designs – a chain stitch, a slip stitch and a single crochet stitch. Watch our how-to videos at LionBrand.com/londonkaye for how to make a slip knot and how to do each of the 3 stitches.

Remember that London's style is big loose stitches! Don't pull your yarn tightly or try for uniform, even stitches. Our diagrams show orderly stitches. Use the diagrams to plot your course, but we encourage you to go your own way and place your stitches as you like.

Our patterns are meant to inspire you to embrace your creative spirit!

HERE'S HOW

Pupil

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Step 1 With A, make a slip knot onto the hook.Chain 3.Join the chain with a slip stitch to make a ring.

Terms

sc = single crochet

turn = turn your piece around so that the side that was facing you is now facing away from you.

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chain
x single crochet
slip stitch



Step 2 Chain 1, make 6 sc into the ring, then join with a slip stitch in first sc – you'll have 6 sc.

Fasten off.




Iris

Step 3 Join B with a slip stitch anywhere along outside edge of pupil.

Chain 1, make 2 sc into the same sc (where you just made the slip stitch), make 2 sc in each sc around the pupil, join with a slip stitch in first sc – you'll have 12 sc.




Step 4 Chain 1, *make 1 sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around, join with a slip stitch in first sc – you'll have 18 sc.



Step 5 Chain 1, *make 1 sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around, join with a slip stitch in first sc – you'll have 24 sc.

Fasten off.




Step 6 Join C with a slip stitch anywhere along outside edge of iris.

Chain 1, *make 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc; repeat from * around, join with a slip stitch in first sc – you'll have 30 sc.


Fasten off.

White of the Eye







Step 7 Join D with a slip stitch in anywhere on the stitches of Step 6. Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of next 7 sc.



Step 8 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 5 white sc - 5 sc.




Step 9 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 3 sc – 3 sc.




Step 10 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc - 2 sc.






Step 11 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in the next sc – 1 sc. Fasten off.



To work the opposite side of the white of the Eye, join D with a slip stich on the opposite side of the iris. Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of next 7 sc.


Step 12 Repeat Steps 8-11. Do not fasten off D.



Step 13 With D, chain 1, turn, work sc stitches evenly spaced around outside edge of the Eye, then join with a slip stitch in first sc.

Fasten off.





Step 14 Join A with a slip stitch in one corner of Eye. Chain 1, then sc in each of the stitches of Step 13 to opposite corner of Eye – working 2 sc in one sc if needed to keep your piece flat. This is the outline of the lower edge of the Eye.

When you create the outline along the top edge of the Eye, you'll also be making lashes.

London made 7 eyelashes – but you can make as many as you like!

Step 15 Sc into the stitches of Step 13 along the top edge of Eye, stopping at each point where you'd like to add a lash. For each lash, chain 5 or 6, then sc in the second chain from the hook and in each of the chains, working back down to the top edge of the Eye.

Continue making sc stitches along the top edge, adding more lashes as you go, then join with a slip stitch in the first sc. Fasten off.

Glue yarn tails to the back of the Eye.
