SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZE

Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

Finished Height About 10 in. (25.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Mandala® Thick & Quick® (Art. #528)
 - 200 Labyrinth 1 cake
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 13 (9 mm), 16 in. (40.5 cm) long

Double pointed knitting needles size 13 (9 mm), set of 5

GAUGE

8 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Stockinette st worked in the round (knit all sts on every round).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTE

Hat is made in one piece in the round, beginning on a circular knitting needle, then changing to double pointed knitting needles when sts are decreased.

HAT

With circular needle, cast on 40 sts.

Place marker for the beginning of the round and join by working the first stitch on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist the stitches.

Round 1: *Knit 1, purl 1; repeat from * to marker.

Rounds 2-5: Repeat Round 1.

Change to Stockinette st worked in the round (knit all sts on every round), and work until piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beginning.

Shape Top of Hat

Note: As you work the next round, change to double pointed needles. Don't forget to move the beginning of round marker onto the double pointed needles!

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Next Round: *Knit next 2 sts together; repeat from * around – you'll have 20 sts.

Next Round: Knit.

Last Round: *Knit next 2 sts together; repeat from * around – you'll have 10 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

Thread yarn tail into blunt needle and draw through remaining sts. Pull to close top of Hat, then knot securely.

FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends.
