Lion Brand® Off The Hook
Patchwork Baby Blanket
Pattern Number: L80258



SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZE

Finished Size

About 36 x 36 in. (91.5 x 91.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Off The Hook (Art. #516)
 - 100 Sugarcane 1 ball (A)
 - 195 Paradise 1 ball (B)
 - 157 Kings Crown 1 ball (C)
 - 105 Made in Blue 2 balls (D)
 - 200 Macaron 2 balls (E)
 - 204 Unicorn 3 balls (F)



BLANKET

Set up

Pull out one end of yarn color A and count out 20 loops. You'll be working on just 18 loops, the other 2 loops are the beginning yarn tail and will be secured later. Lay this length of 20 loops onto a flat surface, with the end of the yarn on your left hand side.

Make Section I

Now you'll be working back and forth in rows across the loops.

Tip

This yarn is designed so that the loops stay in place – you can set the Blanket down at any point and the loops won't come undone!

The yarn that's coming from the yarn ball is called the working yarn, this will be on your right hand side.

Hold the working yarn behind the length of loops.

With your thumb and index finger, reach through the first loop (20th loop from the end) on the beginning of your piece.

Pull the next loop from the working yarn through the first loop.

Row 1: Working from right to left across the length of loops, continue to pull the next loop of working yarn through the next loop on the length of loops until you have 2 loops remaining for the yarn end.

You'll work the next row by working from left to right across the 18 loops.

Row 2: Working from left to right across, pull up a loop of the working yarn in each of the 18 loops, just as you did for Row 1.

Continue to pull up loops, working back and forth in rows, just as on Rows 1 and 2 until you have made a total of 7 rows with yarn A.

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At the end of the 7th row, trim the end of yarn A so that there are only 2-3 loops remaining. Just leave this yarn end hanging – you'll hide it later, when you've finished making the Blanket.

Now you'll be pulling up loops of yarn color B. Start with the 3rd or 4th loop on the strand of B, leaving the first 2 or 3 loops as the yarn tail, and continue working back and forth in rows pulling up a loop in each loop across the row just as you did for Rows 1 and 2, until you have worked a total of 14 rows with yarn B.

At the end of the 14th row, trim the end of yarn B so that there are only 2-3 loops remaining. Leave this yarn end hanging.

Leave 2-3 loops of yarn C free, then start with the 3rd or 4th loop on the strand of C to continue working back and forth in rows pulling up a loop in each loop across the row just as you did for Rows 1 and 2, until you have worked a total of 7 rows with yarn C.

At the end of the 7th row, trim the end of yarn C so that there are only 2-3 loops remaining. Leave this yarn end hanging.

You'll have 18 open loops of C remaining.

Tip

For Sections II-VII, follow along with the diagram to help you make your Blanket!

Make Section II

For Section II, you'll be pulling up loops of yarn along the side edge of Section I. This allows you to work in a different direction with a new color of yarn.

Beginning with the 3rd or 4th loop on the strand of D yarn, pull up 9 loops of D along the A part of Section I, 18 loops along the B part, and 9 loops along the C part – you'll have 36 loops of D.

Work a total of 7 rows with yarn D.

At the end of the 7th row, trim the D yarn just as you did previously.

Make Section III

Beginning with the 3rd or 4th loop on the strand of D yarn, pull up 9 loops of D along the C part of Section I, 18 loops along the B part, and 9 loops along the A part – You'll have 36 loops of D.

Work a total of 7 rows with yarn D.

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At the end of the 7th row, trim the D yarn just as you did previously.

Make Sections IV and V

For Sections IV and V, when you pull up loops of E, sometimes you'll be pulling through loops on the previous section and sometimes through the edge of the previous section.

Make Sections IV and V the same way you made Sections II and III.

Use yarn E and pull up 9 loops of E along each of the D sections and 18 loops along the A or C section.

Make 7 rows with yarn E for Section IV and 7 rows for Section V.

Now you'll need to finish off your E loops.

To do this, work in the same direction as the last row you worked. Pull the 2nd loop through the first loop, then pull the 3rd loop through the 2nd loop. Continue in this way to pull the next loop on the row through the previous loop on the row.

When you get to the last loop, carefully tuck the loop into the Blanket to hide it.

Make Sections VI and VII

Make Sections VI and VII the same way you made Sections IV and V.

Use yarn F and pull up 9 loops of F along each of the E sections and 36 loops along D section.

Make 7 rows with yarn F for Section VI and 7 rows for Section V.

At the end of the 7th row, finish off the F loops just as you did for the E loops.

Carefully cut the loops off the yarn tails, then weave the tails through the loops on the wrong side of the Blanket to secure them.
