

# Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand® Ice Cream® Garter Stitch Baby Afghan Pattern Number: L60359

## <u>SKILL LEVEL</u> – Easy

# <u>SIZE</u>

About 30 x 30 in. (76 x 76 cm)

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Ice Cream® (Art. #923)
  - 206 Tutti Frutti 1 ball (A)
    - 203 Blueberry 1 ball (B)
    - 204 Banana Split 1 ball (C)
    - 201 Cotton Candy 1 ball (D)
- Lion Brand® knitting needles size 5 (3.75 mm)
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

## <u>GAUGE</u>

20 sts + 40 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (knit every st on every row). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## STITCH EXPLANATION

**kfb (knit in front and back)** Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of the same st - 1 st increased.

## **NOTES**

- 1. A Center Square is worked first, then stitches are picked up along the sides of the square to make the Afghan.
- 2. Stitches for the borders are picked up along each edge of the completed Afghan. The border is shaped with mitered and seamed corners.

## AFGHAN

#### Center Square

With A, loosely cast on 40 sts. Work in Garter st (knit every st on every row row) for 80 rows. The last row is a WS row.

## **First Triangle**

**Next Row (RS):** With B, knit. **Decrease row (WS):** With B, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. Repeat last row until only 2 sts remain. K2tog, then cut yarn and fasten off last st.

## Second Triangle

From RS with B, pick up and k40 sts evenly spaced across one side edge of center square.

Decrease row (WS): With B, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog.

Repeat last row until only 2 sts remain.

K2tog, then cut yarn and fasten off last st.



#### Third and Fourth Triangles

Working along next side edge of Center Square, work as for second triangle.

Note that when the fourth triangle has been completed, you'll have created a square; this the larger center square.

#### **Fifth Triangle**

From RS with C, pick up and pick up and k55 sts evenly spaced across one side edge of the larger center square.

Decrease row (WS): With C, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog.

Repeat last row until only 2 sts remain.

K2tog, then cut yarn and fasten off last st.

#### Sixth-Eighth Triangles

Working along next side edge of larger center square, work as for fifth triangle.

Note that when the eighth triangle has been completed, you'll have created a square; this the largest center square.

#### Ninth Triangle

From RS with D pick up and pick up and k80 sts evenly spaced across one side edge of the largest center square.

Decrease row (WS): With D, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog.

Repeat last row until only 2 sts remain.

K2tog, then cut yarn and fasten off last st.

## Tenth-Twelfth Triangles

Working along next side edge of largest center square, work as for ninth triangle.

## **FINISHING**

#### Border

From RS with A, pick up and k110 sts evenly spaced across one edge of Afghan. **Row 1:** Kfb, knit to last st, kfb in last st - at the end of this row, you'll have 112 sts.

#### Row 2: Knit.

Rep Rows 1 and 2, changing color as follows:

Work 13 more rows with A, then work 16 rows with B and 7 rows with C – you'll have 148 sts.

Bind off.

Rep border along each of the 3 remaining sides of Afghan. Sew ends of borders together.

Weave in ends.

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

beg = begin(ning) k = knit k2tog = knit 2 stitches together rep = repeat RS = right side st(s) = stitch(es)
