

Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® Evelina Cabled Wrap

Pattern Number: L80354



SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZE

About 63 in. (160 cm) wide along top edge, 36 in. (91.5 cm) long from back neck to lower edge

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® VANNA'S CHOICE® (Art. #860)
 #105 Silver Blue 9 balls
- LION BRAND® crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

GAUGE

12 sts = about 3 3/4 in. (9.5 cm) in Cable patterns. 14 hdc-blo = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

BPDC (back post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from back to front then to back, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Skip st in front of the BPDC.

FPDC (front post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Skip st behind the FPDC.

BPTR (back post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from back to front then to back, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Skip st in front of the BPTR.

FPTR (front post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Skip st behind the FPTR.

FPTRCross (worked over 3 sts) Skip next st and Puff, FPTR around post of next st; working in front of FPTR just made, dc in skipped Puff; working in front of dc just made, FPTR around post of first skipped st.

hdc-blo (half double crochet in back loop only) Yarn over, insert hook in back loop only of indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Puff (worked all in one st) Yarn over, insert hook in indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop, (yarn over, insert hook in *same* st, yarn over and draw up a loop) 4 times, yarn over, draw through all 11 loops on hook.

PATTERN STITCHES Cable Pattern 1 (worked over 11 sts)

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Rows 1 and 3 (WS): (BPTR around next st, Puff in next st, BPTR around next st, dc in next st) twice, BPTR around next st, Puff in next st, BPTR around next st. Rows 2 and 4: (FPTRCross, dc in next st) twice, FPTRCross.

Note: When working repeats of Row 1, work each BPTR around the post sts only of each FPTRCross.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Cable Pattern 1.

Cable Pattern 2 (worked over 17 sts)

Rows 1 and 3 (WS): Dc in next 4 sts, BPTR around next 9 sts, dc in next 4 sts.

Row 2: Dc in next 4 sts, FPDC around next 3 sts, sk next 3 sts, FPTR around next 3 sts, working in front of 3 sts just worked, FPTR around the 3 skipped sts, dc in next 4 sts.

Row 4: Dc in next 4 sts, sk next 3 sts, FPTR around next 3 sts, working behind 3 sts just worked, FPTR around the 3 skipped sts, FPDC around next 3 sts, dc in next 4 sts.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Cable Pattern 2.

NOTES

- 1. The Wrap is made in 2 sections: Fronts/Upper Back and Lower Back.
- 2. Fronts/Upper Back section is worked first. Sts are then worked along one long edge of Fronts/Upper Back for the Lower Back.
- 3. Two different cable patterns are used in each section. We found that after working just a few rows, it was easy to determine where each pattern should be worked. If you like, place a st marker between each of the patterns to keep your place.
- 4. When working post stitches, you are inserting the hook around the vertical bar of the stitch instead of under the top two loops of the stitch. The side of the work that faces you is the "front", and the side of the work that faces away from you is the "back". For example, to work a FPTR, work as follows:
 - a. Yarn over the hook twice (3 loops on hook).
 - b. Insert hook from front to back to front around post of indicated st, as follows:
 - i. Insert hook from front to back into the space between sts that is immediately before the indicated st.
 - ii. Continue to bring the hook behind the indicated st, and insert it from back to front into the space between sts that immediately follows the indicated st.
 - c. Yarn over and draw the loop all the way back around the post of the st to the front of the work and up to the level of the sts in the current row (4 loops on hook).
 - d. (Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times (1 loop remains on hook)
 - e. Take care to skip the 2 loops at the top of the st into which you would usually work and are now "behind" the post st you just completed.

When you see 'work in pattern as established' in the instructions, this means to work the next row of the pattern sts, lining up sts as in previous rows.

WRAP

Fronts/Upper Back

Ch 68.

Foundation Row (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 67 sc in this row.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, BPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 1 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts; dc in next 4 sts, BPDC around next st, hdc-blo in each st across – 67 sts.

Row 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc-blo in next 28 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 2 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in top of beg ch-3 – 67 sts.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, BPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 3 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts; dc in next 4 sts, BPDC around next st, hdc-blo in each st across.

Row 4: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc-blo in next 28 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 4 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in top of beg ch-3.

Rep Rows 1-4 until piece measures about 63 in. (160 cm) from beg, end with a Row 1 or Row 3 as the last row you work.

Last Row: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Fasten off.

Lower Back

From RS, place 2 markers along the cabled side edge of Fronts/Upper Back, with each marker about 16 in. (40.5 cm) from corners.

Foundation Row (RS): From RS, join yarn with a sl st at one marker, so that you are ready to work along side edge to second marker; ch 1, work 97 sc evenly spaced along side edge to second marker, remove markers – 97 sc.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, BPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 1 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, (dc in next 6 sts, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts) twice, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, BPDC around next st, dc in last st – 97 sts.

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Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, FPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 2 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, (work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, dc in next 6 sts) twice, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in top of beg ch-3.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, BPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 3 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, (dc in next 6 sts, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts) twice, Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, BPDC around next st, dc in top of beg ch-3.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, FPDC around next st, dc in next 4 sts; working Row 4 of each pattern, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts, (work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, dc in next 6 sts) twice, work Cable Pattern 2 over next 17 sts, work Cable Pattern 1 over next 11 sts; dc in next 4 sts, FPDC around next st, dc in top of beg ch-3.

Rep Rows 1-4 until piece measures about 16 in. (40.5 cm) from beg, end with a Row 1 or Row 3 as the last row you work.

Next Row (RS): Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across working last sc in top of beg ch-3.

Last Row: Ch 1, turn, sl st in each st across.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

ch = chain
dc = double crochet
RS = right side
rep = repeat(ing)
sc = single crochet
sk = skip
sl st = slip st
st(s) = stitch(es)
tr = treble (triple) crochet
WS = wrong side
