

Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand® Feels Like Butta Bonus Bundle® Porter Romper

Pattern Number: L90216



SKILL LEVEL – Easy

SIZES

6-9 months (12-18 months)

Finished Chest About 20 (21) in. (51 (53.5) cm)

Finished Length About 14 (15) in. (35.5 (38) cm)

Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger size in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to both sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Feels Like Butta Bonus Bundle® (Art. #123)
 - #173 Sage 1 (1) ball (A)
 - #100 White 1 (1) ball (B)
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size G-6 (4 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

One button, about 1 in. (2.5 cm) diameter Sewing needle and thread

GAUGE

18 hdc + 16 rows/rnds = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

hdc-3rd (half double crochet in 3rd loop) Yarn over, insert hook in 3rd loop of indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook. Note: When working back and forth in rows, the 3rd loop is on the side of the piece that is facing you, immediately below the front loop.

NOTES

- 1. The Romper is made in one piece beginning at neck.
- 2. Work begins in rows to make the back neck opening. Then work proceeds in joined rounds.
- 3. The sleeves are worked directly onto the armholes and an edging is worked around the legs.
- 4. Surface slip stitches are worked to make a faux pocket.
- 5. The yarn amounts are sufficient to make 2 Rompers by simply reversing the colors on the second.

ROMPER

With A, ch 55 (59).

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 5, sl st around post of last hdc for button loop at back neck – you will have 54 (58) hdc and a ch-5 loop in this row

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, hdc-3rd in each st across.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st across.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, hdc in first 9 (10) sts, 3 hdc in next st, place a marker in center st of 3-hdc just made, hdc in next 6 sts, 3 hdc in next st, place a marker in center st of 3-hdc just made, hdc in next 20 (22) sts, 3 hdc in next st, place a marker in center st of 3-hdc just made, hdc in next 6 sts, 3 hdc in next st, place a marker in center st of 3-hdc just made, hdc in next 9 (10) sts – 62 (66) hdc.

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st to next marked st, 3 hdc in marked st and move marker to center st of 3-hdc just made; rep from * 3 more times, hdc in each st to end of row -70 (74) hdc.

Rows 6-10: Rep Row 5 for 5 more times – 110 (114) hdc in Row 10.

Work now proceeds in joined rnds.

Rnd 11: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st to next marked st, 3 hdc in marked st and move marker to center st of 3-hdc just made; rep from * 3 more times, hdc in each st to end of row; join with sl st in first hdc to beg working in joined rnds – 118 (122) hdc.

Rnd 12: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st to next marked st, 3 hdc in marked st and move marker to center st of 3-hdc just made; rep from * 3 more times, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc - 126 (130) hdc.

Rnds 13-15: Rep Rnd 12 for 3 more times - 150 (154) hdc in Rnd 15.

SHAPE ARMHOLES

Rnd 16: Ch 1, turn, *hdc in each st to next marked st, hdc in marked st, skip all sts to next marked st for armhole, hdc in marked st; rep from * once more, hdc in each st to end of rnd; join with sl st in first hdc – 90 (94) hdc.

Next 5 (7) Rnds: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st around: join with sl st in first hdc.

Next 2 Rnds (Decrease Rnds): Ch 1, turn, hdc in first st, sk next st, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st; join with sl st in first hdc – 86 (90) hdc in last rnd worked.

Next 5 (7) Rnds: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc. **Next Rnd (Decrease Rnd):** Ch 1, turn, hdc in first st, sk next st, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st; join with sl st in first hdc – 84 (88) hdc in last rnd worked.

Next 6 Rnds: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc. Fasten off.

FRONT LOWER SECTION

From RS, sk 21 (22) sts following join at center back of piece, join A with sl st in next st.

Row 1: Ch 1, hdc in same st as joining sl st, hdc in next 41 (43) sts; leave rem sts unworked for back lower section – 42 (44) hdc.

Rows 2-5 (Decrease Rows): Ch 1, turn, hdc in first st, sk next st, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st - 34 (36) hdc in Row 5.

Row 6 (Decrease Row): Ch 1, turn, (hdc in next st, sk next st) twice, hdc in each st to last 4 sts, (sk next st, hdc in next st) twice – 30 (32) hdc.

Rows 7-11 (12): Rep Row 2 for 5 (6) more times – 20 hdc.

Next 8 Rows: Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st across.

Fasten off.

BACK LOWER SECTION

From RS, join A with sl st in first unworked st following Row 1 of front lower section.

Work same as front lower section.

FINISHING

Sew last row of front and back lower sections together for crotch.

EDGING

LEGS

From RS, join A with a sl st anywhere along edge of one leg opening.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around leg opening; join with a sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Rep edging around second leg opening.

SLEEVES

From RS, join B with sl st in one underarm.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, hdc in each st around arm opening; join with sl st in first hdc. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: From RS, join A with a sl st in same st as joining sl st, ch 1, hdc in same st and in each st around; join with sl st in frist hdc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st around; join with a sl st in first hdc.

Fasten off.

Rep around opposite armhole for second sleeve.

FAUX POCKET

Row 1: From RS, join B with a sl st around post of hdc in Row 14 that is 8 sts away from left sleeve, sl st around post of next 9 hdc in Row 14. Fasten off.

With sewing needle and thread, sew button to top corner of back neck, opposite button loop.

Weave in yarn ends.

ABBREVIATIONS
