


Free Knitting Pattern LION BRAND® TOUCH OF ANGORA PHAEDRA SHAWL

Pattern Number: M20252 TG



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SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZES

About 48 x 48 x 82 in. (122 x 122 x 208 cm) across largest measurements

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® TOUCH OF ANGORA (Art. #681)
 #101 Light Pink 4 skeins
- LION BRAND® stitch markers
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 9 (5.5 mm), 36 in. (91.5 cm) long or longer 7 in. (18 cm) square of cardboard

GAUGE

15 sts + 25 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over St st (knit on RS, purl on WS). **BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE**

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

Seed st (over an odd number of sts)

Row 1: K1, *p1, k1; rep from * across.

Row 2: Knit the purl sts and purl the knit sts across.

Rep Row 2 for Seed st worked over an odd number of sts.

Yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

- 1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
- 2. Take yarn to back, over the right hand needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

NOTES

- 1. Shawl is worked in one piece in easy stitch patterns and increased sts to create the shape.
- 2. A circular needle is used to accommodate the number of sts. Work back and forth in rows on the circular needle, just as if working on straight needles.
- 3. The first st of every row is slipped to create a tidy edge. Slip this st as if to purl or as if to knit, whichever look you prefer.

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SHAWL

Cast on 3 sts

Row 1 (RS): K3.

Row 2: P3.

Row 3: Sl 1, yo, place marker, k1, place marker, yo, k1 - you'll have 5 sts.

From this point on, always slip the markers as you come to them.

Row 4: SI 1, purl to end of row.

Row 5 (Increase Row): SI 1, yo, k to marker, yo, k1, yo, k to last st, yo, k1 – you'll have 9 sts.

Row 6: SI 1, purl to end of row.

Rep Rows 5 and 6 once more – you'll have 13 sts.

Seed st section

In the Seed st section, you'll keep the first, last and center sts in St st; work increases on every RS row; work sts outside of center st in Seed st.

Continue to slip the markers as you come to them.

Next Row (RS): SI 1, yo, work Row 1 of Seed st to marker, yo, k1, yo, work Row 1 of Seed st to last st, yo, k1.

Next Row: SI 1, work Row 2 of Seed st across to marker, p1, work Seed st to last st, p last st.

Rep last 2 rows once more.

Stockinette st Section

Next 10 rows: Rep Rows 5 and 6 5 times.

Eyelet Section

In the Eyelet section, you'll keep the first, last and center sts in St st; work increases on every RS row; work sts outside of center st in an eyelet pattern.

Continue to slip the markers as you come to them.

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, yo, k1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to marker, yo, k 1, yo, k1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to last stitch, yo, k1.

Next Row: SI 1, p to end of row.

Repeat last 2 rows for 3 more times.

For the remainder of the Shawl, you'll simply rep the Stockinette st, Seed st, and Eyelet st sections.

Rep Stockinette st section for 10 rows.

Rep Seed st section for 6 rows.

Rep Stockinette st section for 12 rows.

Rep Eyelet section for 12 rows.

Rep Stockinette st section for 14 rows.

Rep Seed st section for 8 rows.

Rep Stockinette st section for 14 rows.

Rep Eyelet section for 14 rows.

Rep Stockinette st section for 16 rows.

Rep Seed st section for 10 rows.

Rep Stockinette st section for 16 rows.

Rep Eyelet section for 14 rows.

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Next Row: Sl 1, yo, k to marker, yo, k1, yo, k to last st, yo, k1.

Last Row: Knit. *Bind off loosely.*

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

TASSELS (make 3)

Wrap yarn around cardboard 50 times.

Cut an 18 in. (45.5 cm) length of yarn and thread doubled into blunt needle. Insert needle under all strands at upper edge of cardboard. Pull tightly and knot securely near strands.

Cut yarn loops at lower edge of cardboard. Do not cut the piece of yarn, it will be used to tie the tassel to the Shawl.

Cut another 18 in. (45.5 cm) length of yarn and wrap tightly around tassel, about 1 1/2 in. (4 cm) below top knot to make tassel neck.

Knot securely; thread varn ends into blunt needle and weave ends to center of tassel.

Trim tassel ends evenly.

Tie a tassel to each corner of Shawl.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

p = purl

rep = repeat

RS = right side

sl = slip

st(s) = stitch(es)

WS = wrong side
