**LION BRAND® OFF THE HOOK® GLITZ
GLAM LOOP PILLOW**

Pattern Number: M20234 OHG



SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZES

About 12 x 12 in. (30 x 30 cm)

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® OFF THE HOOK® GLITZ (Art. #519)
#106 Sky Blue 2 balls
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

12 x 12 in. (30 x 30 cm) pillow form

A few yards (meters) of smooth yarn

PILLOW

Set Up

Pull out one end of yarn and count out 19 loops. You'll be working on just 17 loops. This length of 17 loops will be the beginning of your Pillow, the other 2 loops are beginning yarn tail and will be secured later.

Lay this length of 19 loops onto a flat surface, with the end of the yarn on your left hand side.

Check to be sure that all loops are facing upwards and that the loops aren't twisted.

Pillow front

Now you'll be working in rows across the length of loops.

Tip

This yarn is designed so that the loops stay in place – you can set the Pillow down at any point and the loops won't come undone!

The yarn that's coming from the yarn ball is called the working yarn.

Hold the working yarn behind the length of loops.

First Row

With your thumb and index finger, reach through the first loop (17th loop from the end) on the beginning of your Pillow.

Pull the next loop from the working yarn through the first loop.

Working across the length of loops, continue to pull the next loop of working yarn through the next loop on the length of loops until you have pulled up 17 loops – and have 2 loops remaining for the yarn end.

Second Row

For the second row you'll be working from left to right to create the loop texture. Fold loops from previous row down towards lower edge so you can see horizontal bumps that are behind every stitch. Pull next loop from the working yarn up from behind through first bump from previous row. Continue to pull next loop from the working yarn up from behind through next exposed bump, across the row.

Continue alternating between the first and second rows until your piece measures about 20 in. (51 cm) from beginning.

Finish you Pillow

Now you'll need to finish off your loops. Drop the working yarn.

Working in the same direction as the last row you made, pull the second loop through the first; pull the third loop through the second; pull the fourth through the third – and so on across to the end of the row.

Now you're back at the side with working yarn. Cut the working yarn, leaving a yarn tail with about 4-5 loops. Carefully snip these remaining loops off the working yarn tail. Pull working yarn through the last loop and knot.

Carefully snip the remaining loops from each yarn tail. Just snip the loops off, don't cut through the yarn!

Fold Pillow in half. Thread the blunt needle with a length of smooth yarn and sew two open sides of the Pillow together, leaving one side of Pillow unsewn.

Insert pillow form through the unsewn side, then finish sewing closed.

With your fingers, stuff any visible yarn tails to the inside of the Pillow.
