**LION BRAND® OFF THE HOOK® GLITZ
RIPPLE BLANKET**

Pattern Number: M20237 OHG



SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZES

About 37 x 45 in. (94 x 114.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® OFF THE HOOK® GLITZ (Art. #519)
 - #146 Lilac 3 balls (A)
 - #103 Bubble Gum 3 balls (B)
 - #106 Sky Blue 3 balls (C)



SPECIAL STITCHES

LK = one loop knit

LDR = (Loop Decrease Right) stack the next 2 loops together with the 2nd loop in front of the 1st loop. Pull the next loop on the yarn through both loops.

LDL = (Loop Decrease Left) stack the next 2 loops together with the 1st loop in front of the 2nd loop. Pull the next loop on the yarn through both loops.

INC = Increase, pull up next loop on yarn, in same place as previous loop.

BLANKET

Set up

Pull out one end of yarn color A and count out 54 loops. You'll be working on just 52 loops, the other 2 loops are the beginning yarn tail and will be secured later.

Lay this length of 52 loops onto a flat surface, with the end of the yarn on your left hand side.

Check to be sure that all loops are facing upwards and that loops aren't twisted.

Make your Blanket

Now you'll be working back and forth in rows across the loops.

Tip

This yarn is designed so that the loops stay in place – you can set the Blanket down at any point and the loops won't come undone!

The yarn that's coming from the yarn ball is called the working yarn.

Hold the working yarn behind the base of 54 loops so that you are ready to work from right to left.

Row 1: Working from right to left, *LDR over the next 2 loops, LK in each of the next 4 loops, INC, LK in next loop, INC, LK in each of the next 4 loops, LDL over the next 2 loops, Repeat from * 3 more times – you'll have 52 loops, and 2 loops remaining for the yarn end.

Do not turn the piece.

Row 2: Working from left to right, LK in each loop – 52 loops.

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Rows 3-4: Repeat rows 1 and 2.

Change to B.

With B, repeat Rows 1-4.

Change to C.

With C, work rows 1-4.

Continue to work 4 rows with A, B, and then with C, until all the yarn is used in full stripes, ending with a Row 4.

FINISH YOUR BLANKET

Now you'll need to finish off your loops. Drop the working yarn.

Working in the same direction as the last row you made, pull the second loop through the first; pull the third loop through the second; pull the fourth through the third – and so on across to the end of the row.

Now you're back at the side with the working yarn. Carefully snip the loops off the working yarn tail. Pull working yarn through the last loop and knot.

Carefully snip the remaining loops from each yarn tail. Just snip the loops off, don't cut through the yarn! Pull each of the trimmed tails through the loops of the Blanket to secure them.
