The Osmo finishing system

- protects the wood from in- and outside
- does not form a film
- forms a protecting, micro-porous surface

Advantages of traditional oil-based finishes

- ▶ Penetrate into the wood
- ▶ "Firing" of the wood
- Can simply and partially be renovated
- Do not crack, flake, peel or blister

Disadvantages

- Deficient resistance against liquids
- Very time-consuming maintenance



Ugly water marks can quickly appear due to insufficient resistance against liquids.



Lacquers and water-based finishing systems



This system

- protects the wood from outside
- is film-forming
- generates a thick layer

Advantages of lacquers and water-based finishes

- ➤ The finish forms a film/layer on the top of the wood surface
- ► Good resistance against liquids
- Protects from abrasion
- Easy maintenance

Disadvantages

- ► For renovation the whole area needs to be sanded
- The surface cannot be renovated partially
- ► The finish does crack, flake peel and blister



To renovate a floor, the laquered surface must first be sanded down.
