½ yard of yellow solid fabric - includes binding

¼ yard of white solid fabric

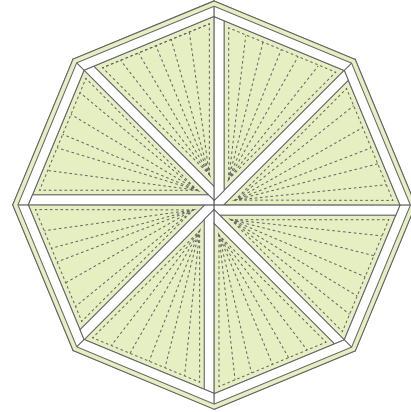

Missouri Star Large Simple Wedge Template for 10" Squares

Quilter's Select Free Fuse Powder - optional

Batting



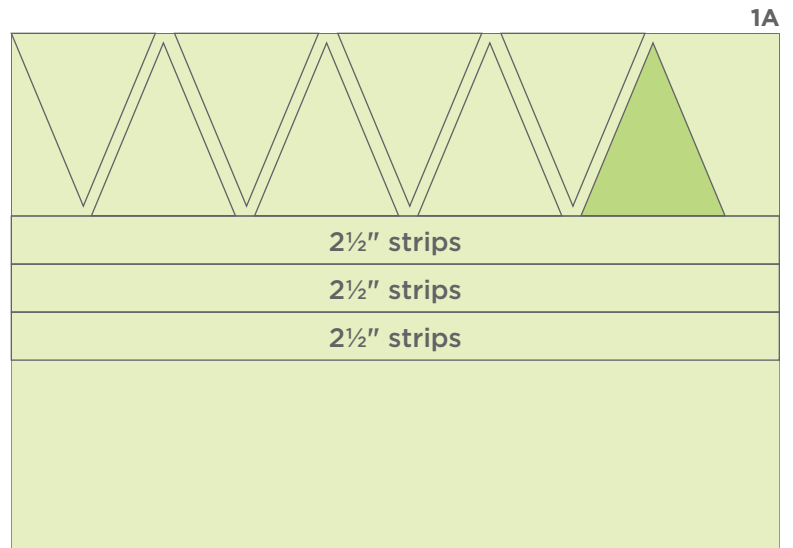
1 cut

From the yellow solid:

- Cut (1) 9½" strip across the width of the fabric.
- Use the template to cut 8 wedges from the strip.

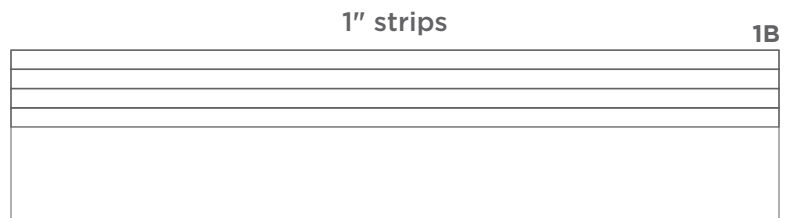
- Cut (3) 2½" strips across the width of the fabric and set them aside for the binding. **1A**

From the white solid:

- Cut (4) 1" strips across the width of the fabric. **1B**

2 sew the wedges

Place a white strip on top of the long right edge of a yellow wedge, right sides together. Sew the 2 pieces together, then sew about 1½" past the bottom of the wedge. **2A**

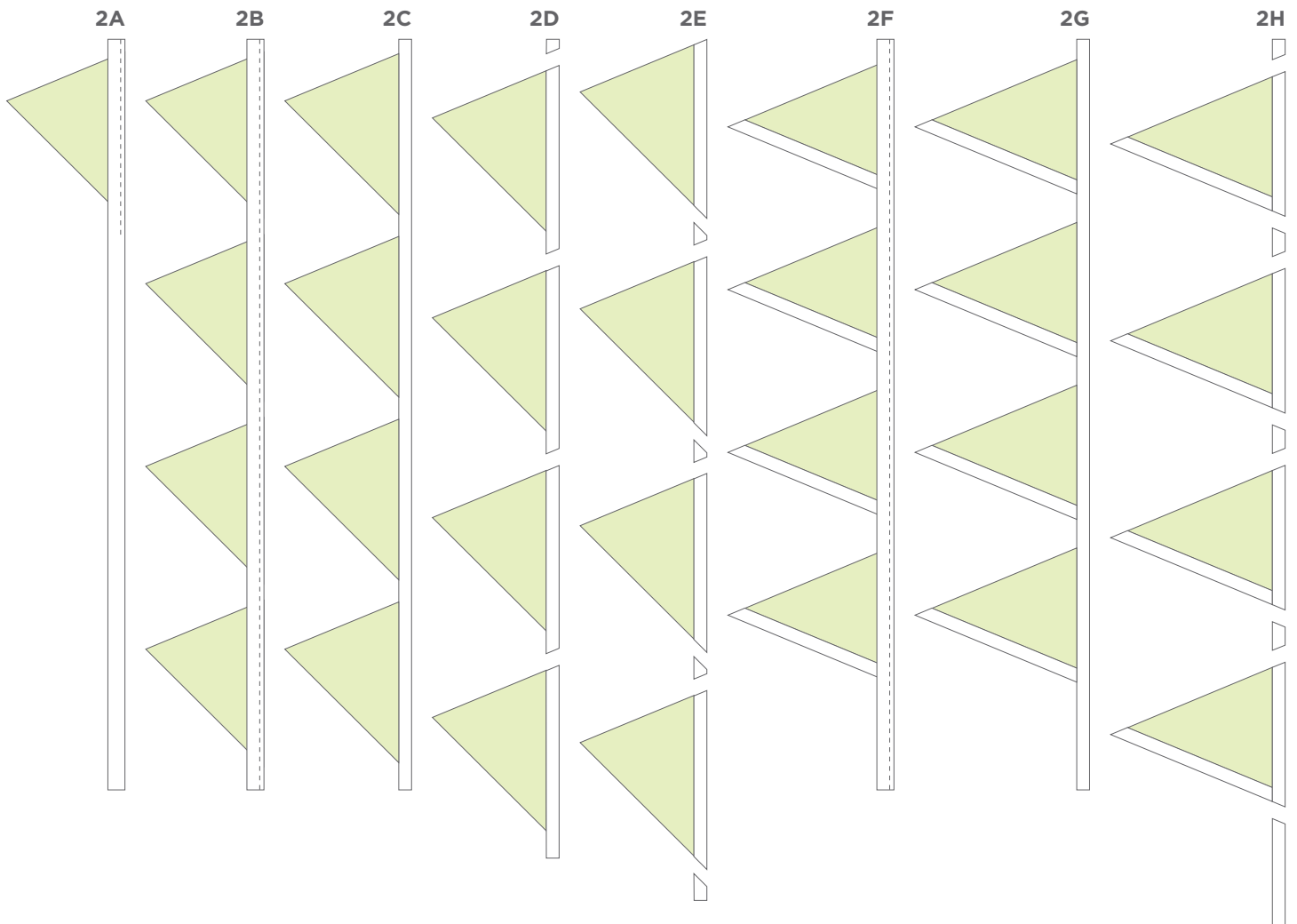
Slide another yellow wedge underneath and line it up with the strip. Sew it to the strip. Repeat until you have sewn 4 wedges to the strip. Press towards the strip. **2B 2C**

Repeat to add the 4 remaining wedges to a second strip.

Use a ruler to trim the white strip at the same angle as the yellow wedges. **2D 2E**

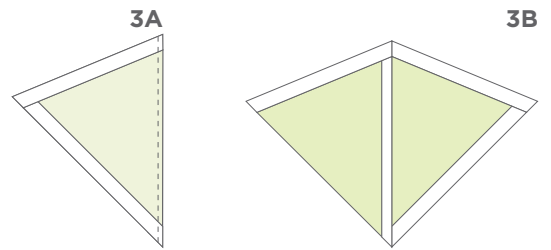
Place a white strip on top of the shorter edge of a yellow wedge, right sides together. Sew the 2 pieces together, then sew about 1½" past the end of the wedge. Similar to before, add 3 more wedges to the strip, then repeat to add 4 wedges to a second strip. Press towards the strips. **2F 2G**

Similar to before, trim the strips even with the wedges. **2H**

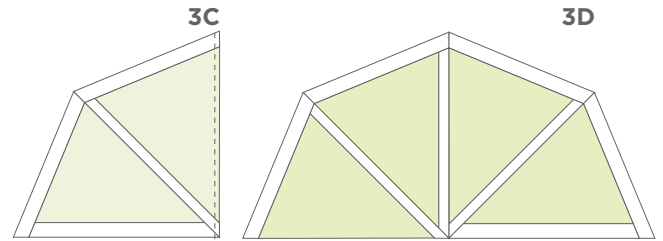


3 sew the table topper

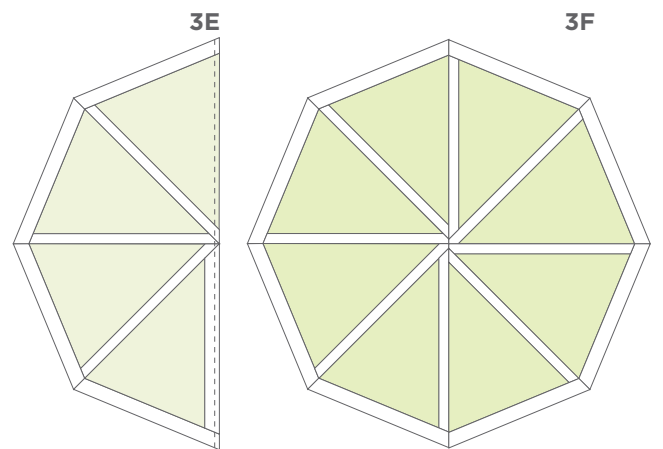
Place 2 wedges right sides together. Sew along 1 long edge as shown. **Make 4.** Press each pair in the same direction. **3A 3B**



Place 2 pairs right sides together. Sew along 1 long edge as shown. Trim off the dog ears and press. **Make 2 halves.** **3C 3D**



Place the 2 halves right sides together. Place a pin in the center and sew along the long edge as shown. Press. **3E 3F**

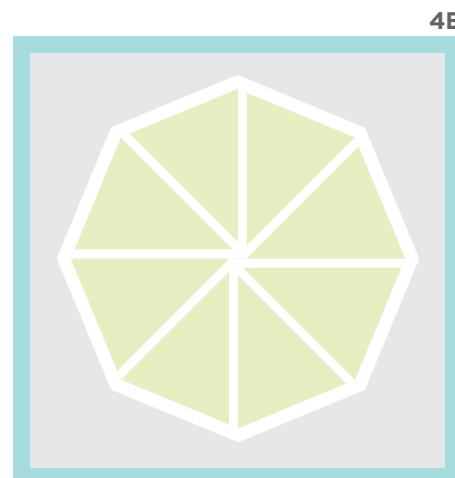
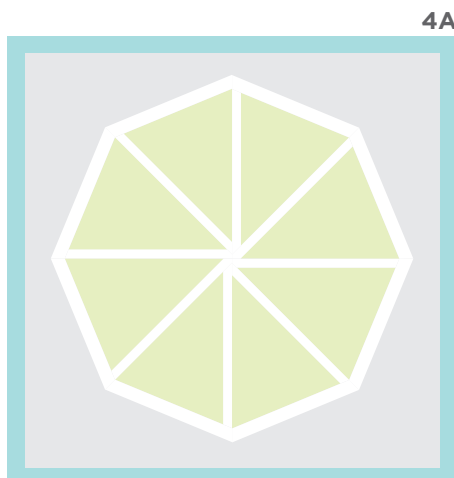


4 quilt & bind

Lay a 25-26" backing square right side down on your pressing surface. Place a 23-24" batting square on top of the backing, then use the free fuse powder to baste the layers. Place the project top on top of the batting square, then use the free fuse powder to baste again. **4A**

Quilt as desired. Misty did straight line quilting on her domestic sewing machine that echoes the wedges. **4B**

After the quilting is complete, trim the project even with the project top and use the 2½" yellow strips you set aside earlier to bind.

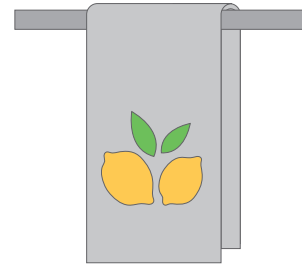
Tea Towel

Missouri Star Sew Light Fusible Adhesive*

Yellow Fabric*

Green Fabric*

**Scraps of these items are perfect for this project.*

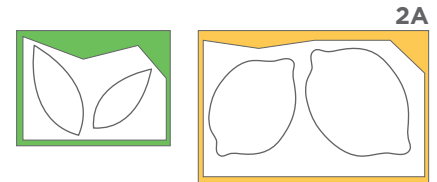


1 prepare

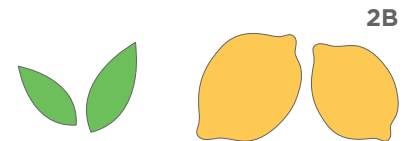
Prewash your tea towel to avoid shrinkage later on.

2 trace

Select the lemon shapes you wish to appliqué onto your towel from page 2. Trace your selected shapes onto the paper side of the fusible adhesive. Roughly cut around the shapes to separate them, then follow the manufacturer's instructions to fuse them to the reverse side of the appropriately colored fabric. **2A**



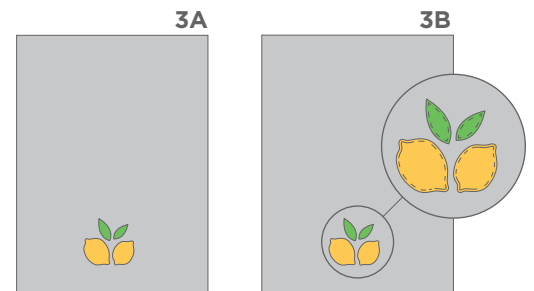
Neatly cut on the traced lines. **2B**



3 fuse

Place the appliqué shapes on your tea towel. When you are happy with their placement, follow the manufacturer's instructions to fuse the fabric in place. **3A**

Sew around the perimeter of each shape with your favorite applique stitch. Misty used a straight stitch, but a satin, blanket, or small zigzag stitch are all good options. **3B**



Your towels are now ready to adorn your kitchen!
