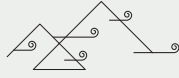
The MacFarlands had family devotions every evening after dinner. They read the Bible, sang hymns, and prayed together.

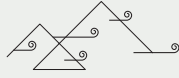


Donovan and the rest of the children

please tell us the story.” So Grandpa began.



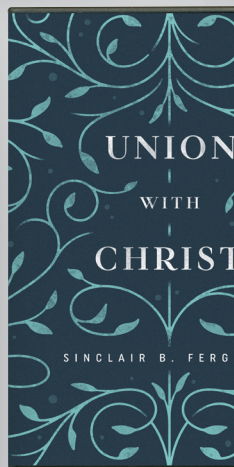
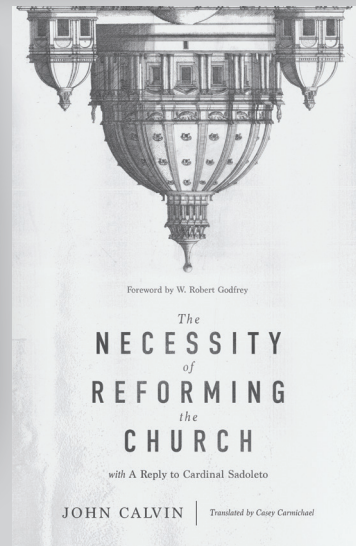
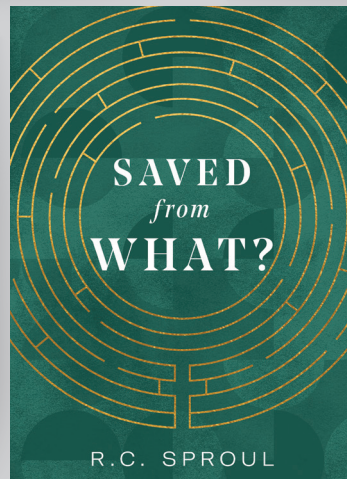
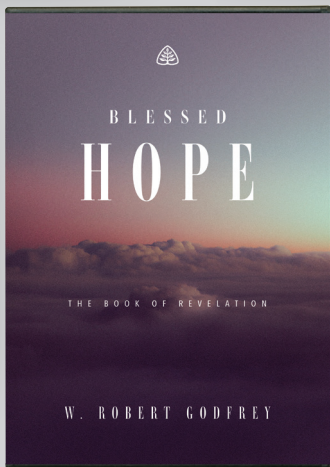
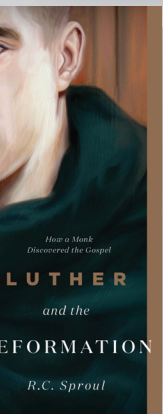
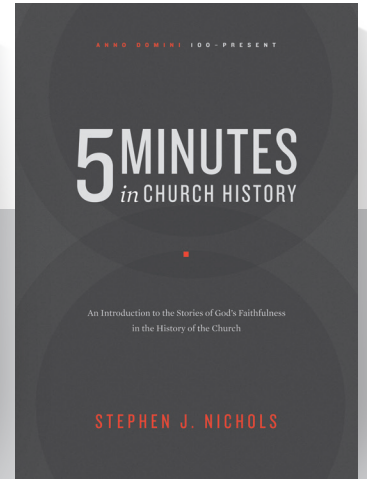
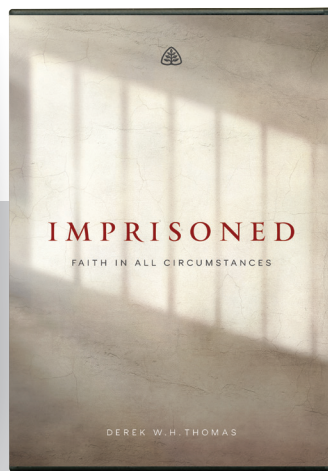
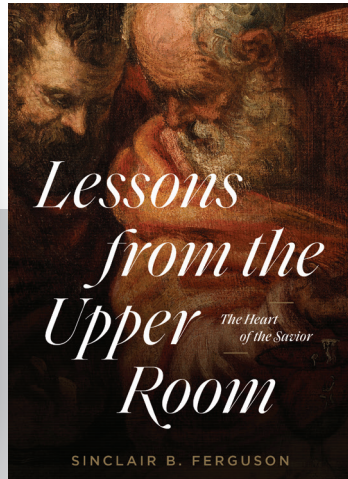
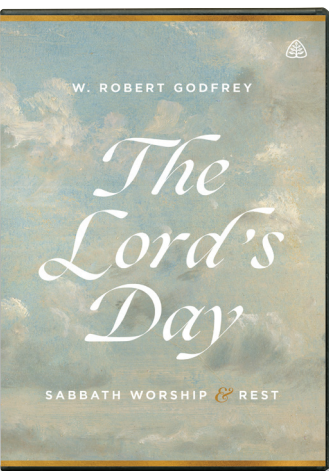
Many centuries ago, in a distant land, there lived a knight. His name was Sir Charles, and he was a knight without a king.
