

## MARBLE & NATURAL STONE

Quarried directly from the earth, marble and natural stone vary in veining, texture and color. Whether polished, sandblasted or hand-carved, each is valued for its unique pattern and natural beauty.

## Care for Your Marble & Natural Stone

- > Address spills immediately with a dry, soft cloth. Natural stone is a porous material, and although it has been sealed, spills should be blotted promptly to minimize staining.
- > Use a soft, slightly damp cloth to dust or spot-clean as needed. Wipe dry.
- > Avoid using abrasive cleaners, chemical solvents, strong detergents, furniture polish, and cleaners with bleach.
- > Use trivets, coasters, placemats, and adhesive felt pads to help prevent scratches.



## RECLAIMED WOODS

Each piece is hand-crafted from reclaimed and recycled woods with unique characteristics. Natural splits and knots, weathering and wear from years of exposure, and mars left from previous use create a rich palette of rustic textures and colors.

The one-of-a-kind character of reclaimed wood is thoughtfully preserved in each design. Crafted with classic joinery, each piece is hand-finished in sophisticated neutral tones to enhance natural patinas as well as protect surfaces for everyday use.

## Care for your Reclaimed Furniture

Reclaimed woods are distinctly marked by the environment and the passage of time. Unique features of the wood including small knots, splits, and cracks have been preserved to add rustic character to each piece. By their nature, salvaged woods will respond to changes in temperature and humidity. Maintain yours with these care essentials:

- > Dust regularly with a clean, dry cloth in the direction of the grain.
- > Do not use furniture polish, ammonia-based cleaners, or other chemicals.
- > Address spills immediately by wiping with a dry, soft cloth.
- > Use coasters, placemats, and trivets to protect surfaces from wet or hot cups or dishes.
- > Avoid direct contact between sharp objects and the surface to prevent scratching.
- > Keep out of direct sunlight.
- > Always lift and carry, do not drag, when moving furniture.
