SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZES

About 6 in. (15 cm) high

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® FOR THE HOME CORDING (Art. #771)
 #123 Buff 2 balls
- LION BRAND® crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- LION BRAND® stitch markers
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Polyester fiberfill

Dried beans, aquarium or floral pebbles or clean, small rocks – your choice of a material to use as a fill to add weight to the Doorstop

GAUGE

Rnds 1-4 = about 4 in. (10 cm) diameter. 13 hdc + 11 rnds = about 4 in. (10 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

NOTES

- 1. Doorstop is worked in continuous rnds (spiral), from the base upwards. Do not turn at the beginning of rnds and do not join last st of rnd to first st with a sl st.
- 2. Drawstring is worked separately, threaded through ch-1 sps and pulled to close opening at top of Doorstop. The ends of the Drawstring are sewn together to form handle loop.

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DOORSTOP

- Ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
- **Rnd 1:** Ch 1, work 8 hdc in ring; do not join, work in continuous rnds (spiral)— you will have 8 sts in this rnd.
- Place a marker in last st made to indicate end of rnd. Move marker up as each rnd is completed.
- Rnd 2: Work 2 hdc in each st around 16 sts.
- **Rnd 3:** * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st; rep from * around 24 sts.
- **Rnd 4:** Hdc in next st, * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 2 sts; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in last st 32 sts.
- **Rnd 5:** * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts; rep from * around 40 sts.
- **Rnd 6:** Hdc in next 2 sts, * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 4 sts; rep from * to last 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in last 2 sts 48 sts.
- Rnd 7: * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 5 sts; rep from * around 56 sts.
- **Rnd 8:** Hdc in next 3 sts, * 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 6 sts; rep from * to last 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in last 3 sts 64 sts.
- Rnds 9-12: Hdc in each st around.
- Rnd 13: Hdc in next 3 sts, * hdc2tog, hdc in next 6 sts; rep from * to last 5 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last 3 sts 56 sts.
- Rnd 14: Hdc in each st around.
- **Rnd 15:** * Hdc2tog, hdc in next 5 sts; rep from * around 48 sts.
- Rnd 16: Hdc in each st around.
- Rnd 17: Hdc in next 2 sts, * hdc2tog, hdc in next 4 sts; rep from * to last 4 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last 2 sts 40 sts.
- Rnd 18: Hdc in each st around.
- **Rnd 19:** * Hdc2tog, hdc in next 3 sts; rep from * around 32 sts.
- Rnd 20: Hdc in each st around.
- **Rnd 21:** Hdc in next st, * hdc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts; rep from * to last 3 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last st 24 sts.
- Rnd 22: Hdc in each st around.
- Rnd 23: * Hdc2tog, hdc in next st; rep from * around 16 sts.
- Rnd 24: Hdc in each st around.
- Rnd 25: * Hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * around; join with slip st in first hdc 8 hdc and 8 ch-1 sps. Fasten off.

DRAWSTRING

Ch 51.

Row 1: SI st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

FINISHING

Thread Drawstring in and out through ch-1 sps of last rnd of Doorstop.

Stuff Doorstop

Stuff the Doorstop with a layer of fiberfill. The fiberfill is to shape the Doorstop and to keep the heavier fill from escaping through the spaces between sts.

Gently shape a hollow in the center of the fiberfill, then fill the hollow with pebbles or dried beans.

Tip: Roll a sheet of paper into a cone shape, with an opening at the narrow end, and use this as a funnel to insert the heavier fill.

Add a small amount of fiberfill over top of the pebbles or beans to keep them inside the Doosrstop.

Pull ends of Drawstring to close opening at top of Doorstop and knot.

Sew ends of Drawstring together to form a loop for handle.

Weave in ends.
