To avoid problems, read this manual carefully before carrying out any operation on the wash unit and follow the instructions scrupulously.

Without prejudice to the main technical and safety features of the product, the manufacturer reserves the right to make changes to the wash unit for reasons of continual technical and technological evolution without prior notice, without incurring any penalty.

The partial or total reproduction of this manual, including texts and illustrations, is prohibited by law.

The Court of Reggio Emilia (Italy) is competent in case of disputes.

PREREQUISITES

The following requirements must be observed for a correct and safe installation of the equipment:

- 1) The floor must comply with DIN 1055 B 1.3 and DIN 18560 T 1.
- **2**) The electrical system must comply with **CEI 64.4** standards, using **250V/16A** differential protection conductors (<30mA).
- 3) Do not connect devices that are not specified as part of the system.
- 4) Earthing, in particular, must comply with Article 3.2.01 of the aforementioned standards.
- 5) The equipment must be fixed to the floor using anchor bolts with a minimum diameter of 8 mm.

The manufacturer is not liable for the safety and reliability of the equipment if:

- installation and repairs are not carried out by authorised technicians
- the general and electrical installation of the room does not comply with the requirements indicated above
- the device was not installed following this manual
- the device is not used following this manual.

INTENDED USE

The wash unit chair is intended for professional use in hair treatment salons, particularly in the hair washing area.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

The wash unit chair is intended for professional use in hair treatment salons, particularly in the hair washing area. It cannot be used by more than one operator at the same time and can accommodate only one customer at a time. The maximum load capacity is 120 kg. The equipment must be fixed to the floor. The installation is compliant if carried out according to the specifications indicated in the Installation, Use and Maintenance Manual. The equipment must be fixed with anchor bolts with a minimum diameter of 8 mm. Sitting on the worktops and armrests is not permitted. Multiple people are not allowed to sit together. It is not allowed to get seated and/or get up while the footrest is moving or if the chair being raised.

Beware of scalding caused by hot water.

Beware of moving parts of the wash unit chair.

DEFINITIONS

Hairdresser, or operator, is the person who performs the treatment of the customer's hair and who manages the operation of the wash unit chair. The workstation is situated at the back of the wash unit chair. **Customer** is the person who is receiving the hair treatment. The front part of the wash unit chair is used to seat the customer.

SAFETY



The equipment complies with the essential European Union regulations on ergonomics and safety. The manufacturer guarantees these qualities by affixing the CE marking.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

The packages must be transported on closed vehicles. Do not drop or tilt packages during loading and unloading. The products must be stored in a dry, indoor place, stacking up to three packages on top of each other and without drastic temperature changes.










Dimensions in mm.

WARNING: Open the side panel before fixing the wash unit in a side-by-side arrangement with a side drain.


Plant layout




- 1 = Hot 3/8" (1/2" thermostatic mixer)

- 4 = Fix the supplied flange with the appropriate screws on the **outside** of the shoulder.
- 5 = Open the side panel.


Preparation

- 1) Remove the packaging leaving the wash unit mounted on the pallet so that it is easier to transport. Remove the wash unit protections and any accessories contained in the packaging itself.
- 2) Position the wash unit and mark the fixing points (Fig. 2). Drill holes for the anchor bolts.


Fixing the wash unit

WARNING: Prepare the holes for the drain and electrical power supply, if applicable before fixing the wash units, either in side-by-side arrangement or with side drain.


1) Undo the screws (1) fastening the rear casing.



2) Undo the two screws fixing the wash unit to the pallet (2) and position the wash unit in the spot prepared for installation.



3) Place the two nylon discs supplied (1) under the base of the wash unit and fix it to the floor with the anchor bolts suitable for the type of material of which the floor is made using the four holes provided for the purpose.



INSTALLATION

Floor drain


The water connection may only be carried out by qualified technicians

Open the side panel (Point 2) if the installation requires infeed of the power supply from the wall or in a side-by-side arrangement.

1) Install the water unit using \emptyset 3/8" hydraulic connections (1/2" if thermostatic). It is advisable to provide a gate valve upstream of each fitting.

Connections to the sewage system are established using a ø 40 drain pipe.

Plant layout




1 = Hot 3/8"

2 = Cold 3/8"


 $3 = \emptyset 40 \text{ mm drain}$


Wall drain

WARNING:

The water connection may only be carried out by qualified technicians

Open the side panel if the installation requires a power supply inlet from the wall or in a side-by-side arrangement.


- 1) Opening the side panel
- 1 = Determine the height of the wall drain from the ground
- 2 = Open the rear wash unit casing.
- 3 = Locate the pre-existing slot on the inside of the shoulder and drill a centring hole at the measured height.
- 4 = Fix the supplied flange with the appropriate screws on the outside of the shoulder.
- 5 = Open the side panel.



2) Install the water unit using \emptyset 3/8" hydraulic connections (1/2" if optional thermostatic). It is advisable to provide a gate valve upstream of each fitting.

Connections to the sewage system are established using a ø 40 drain pipe.

Plant layout




1 = Hot 3/8''

ELECTRICAL CONNECTION

WARNING:

The electrical connection may only be carried out by qualified technicians

Check that the electrical system complies with Points 2 and 4 of the PREREQUISITES on page 4.

It is advisable to provide an automatic switch and disconnector to cut off power to the wash units at any time.

- 1) The wash unit models that require an electrical power supply are equipped with a 3x1, 1.5 m long cord with a Schuko plug. Plug it into the socket.
- 2) By opening the junction box (fig. 1) of the wash unit, it is possible to connect the mains wires directly to the terminal board $N \oplus L$ (fig.2).










3) **WARNING:** The seat can move on some models. Make sure that the cables are not pulled (or can be pulled when the seat is moved) when connecting the wash unit. Also, make sure that they are not close to moving mechanisms.

TESTING

Once the connection has been established, test all the functions of the equipment, preferably with a person sitting in the chair:


- footrest all up
- footrest all down
- full cycle of the massage function
- cold water (mixer all open with the lever all to the left)
- hot water (mixer all open with the lever all to the right)
- drain (partially fill the basin, remove the cap and drain, repeat operation two or three times).
- 1) After testing, reposition the rear casing using the screws (1).



USE

Switching on the wash unit

The wash unit is switched on by plugging it into the power supply.




Keypad for operating the electric footrest (1)


This keypad can be used to activate the device for adjusting the wash unit footrest.


Relax control pedal D5710030 (Optional)

Keypad for operating the jet massage (1)


This keypad can be used to activate the device for adjusting the wash unit footrest and massage.

This foot pedal can be used to activate the device for adjusting the wash unit footrest and massage.




Jet massage control panel C6420007



Jet massage control pedal G060040 (Optional)


Chair

- Check the wear condition of the chair every month.
- Check that the side armrests are firmly attached and secure (1) every six months.
- Clean and lubricate moving parts every six months.




Washbasin unit

- Check every two months that there are no water leaks under the washbasin which could damage the base and the wash unit equipment. To do this, remove the casing of the wash unit by undoing the appropriate screws (1) so that the part under the washbasin is visible.



Washbasin unit

- Check the tightness of the oscillating system every two months and, if necessary, tighten the two nuts (2) that adjust the stiffness of the movement of the washbasin to achieve the right friction by turning them clockwise.



Cleaning the surfaces

- Disconnect power to the wash unit before cleaning or doing other jobs.
- Do not use solvents to clean the metal parts. Only use a damp cloth.
- Use only sanitising liquid to clean plastic parts.
- The upholstery of the chair must be cleaned with mild soap and water.
- Do not use alcohol-based products.

Never use aggressive or abrasive cleaning agents.

Please note that the chemicals contained in many hair treatment products can cause permanent stains on plastic surfaces or painted parts that cannot be removed.

Electrical functions

If the equipment does not work, check that:

the power plug is inserted correctly (check the connection)

the control has not come into contact with water (disconnect the power to the wash unit wait 2 hours and try again)


the control has not been pulled excessively (disconnect the power supply to the wash unit, open the rear casing and check the connection).

Warning:

- Do not use the equipment in case of water leakage.
- If the power cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, a technical assistance technician or qualified personnel to prevent hazards.

IDENTIFICATION OF THE EQUIPMENT

Always quote the serial number when communicating with the manufacturer or service centres.
