

Granny Square Bucket Hat

Lion Brand® Feels Like Butta® Thick & Quick®

SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZE

Finished Circumference About 21 in. (53.5 cm), will stretch to fit most sizes

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® FEELS LIKE BUTTA® THICK & QUICK® (Art. #155)
 - #139 Woodrose 1 ball (A)
 - #157 Buttered Popcorn 1 ball (B)
 - #184 Peach Blush 1 ball (C)
- LION BRAND® crochet hook size N-13 (9 mm)
- LION BRAND® stitch markers
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



1 Granny Square = about 5 x 5 in. (12.5 x 12.5 cm). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.



NOTES

- 1. Four Granny Squares are crocheted then joined into a ring to make the side of Hat.
- 2. Top Granny is crocheted, then joined to one edge of side. The Brim is worked directly onto opposite edge of side.
- 3. Granny Squares and Top Granny are worked in joined rnds. Join last stitch of rounds to first stitch with a slip stitch. Do not turn work at beginning of rounds.
- 4. Rounds of Granny Squares and Top Granny are worked using multiple yarn colors. To change yarn color, fasten off old color and join new color as instructed.
- 5. Brim is worked in continuous rounds (spiral). Do not join last stitch of rounds to first stitch. Yarn color is changed to make stripes. To change yarn color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

GRANNY SQUARES (make 4)

With A, ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): With A, ch 3 (counts as dc), work 15 dc in ring; join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – you will have 16 dc in this rnd.

Fasten off.

Rnd 2: From RS, draw up a loop of B in any sp between sts, ch 3 (counts as dc), 3 dc in same sp, * sk next 2 dc, 4 dc in next sp between sts; rep from * to last 2 dc, sk last 2 dc; join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – 32 dc (eight 4-dc groups).

Fasten off.

Rnd 3: From RS, draw up a loop of C in any sp between 4-dc groups, ch 3 (counts as dc), (dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in same sp (corner made), (ch 1, sk next 2 dc, sc in next sp between sts) 3 times, * ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next sp between sts, (ch 1, sk next 2 dc, sc in next sp between sts) 3 times; rep from * to last 2 dc ch 1, sk last 2 dc; join with sl st in top of beg ch-3 – 16 dc, 12 sc, and 20 ch-1 sps (4 dc, 3 sc, and 4 ch-1 sps along each of 4 sides between corner ch-1 sps).

Fasten off.

Join Squares into a ring to make side

- 1. The 4 Squares are crocheted together to make a ring.
- 2. Each crochet seam begins with a single crochet (sc) and ends with an half double crochet (hdc). The beginning sc is at top of Hat and the ending hdc is at lower edge of Hat.
- 3. Take care to crochet all seams in the same direction, from the top edge (beg with an sc) down to the lower edge (end with an hdc).

Hold 2 Granny Squares with WS together and stitches matching. From RS and working through both thicknesses, join A with sc in any corner ch-1 sp of the 2 Squares, sc in each dc, sc and ch-1 sp to next corner ch-1 sp, hdc in corner ch-1 sp - 13 sts.

Fasten off.

Rep to join all 4 Squares into a strip, then rep once more to join ends of strip together to make a ring.

TOP GRANNY SQUARE

With A, ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnds 1 and 2: Work same as Rnds 1 and 2 of Granny Square.

Rnd 3: From RS, draw up a loop of A in any sp between 4-dc groups, ch 2 (counts as hdc), sk next dc, sc in next 3 dc, * hdc in next sp between 4-dc groups, sk next dc, sc in next 3 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch-2 – 8 hdc and 24 sc.

Do not fasten off.

Rnd 4: With A, ch 1, sc in same st as joining sl st, sc in next st, * 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc - 40 sc.

Fasten off.

Join Top Granny

- 1. To join Top Granny to side, you'll work single crochet (sc) through both thicknesses, evenly spaced around.
- 2. There are more stitches in top edge of side than in last round of Top Granny. To work sc evenly spaced around, skip some stitches (we recommend skipping ch-1 sps) along the top edge of the side.
- 3. To make it easier to work 40 sc evenly spaced around, you'll place stitch markers in every 10th stitch of the Top Granny and then through a corresponding seam of the side, then work 10 sc between each pair of markers.

Using stitch markers this way has the added advantage of holding the Top Granny in place as you work!

With RS of both pieces facing outwards, hold Top Granny against side. Beginning in a Top Granny st that is near a seam on the side, place a marker through Top Granny st and through top of seam on side, (sk next 9 sts of Top Granny, place a marker through next st of Top Granny and through top of next seam on Granny Square circle) 3 times (4 markers placed).

Rnd 1 (RS): From RS and working through both thicknesses, join A with sl st in any marked st (seam on Granny Square circle), work 10 sc between each marker—40 sc.

Fasten off.

Brim

Rnd 1: From RS, join A with sl st in any st or ch-1 sp along lower edge of side, sc in each seam, dc, sc, and ch-1 sp along sides of Granny Squares (but skip the corner ch-1 sps), and seam around, do NOT join, work in continuous rnds – 48 sc.

Place a marker in last st made to indicate end of rnd. Move marker up as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: With A, * sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st; rep from * around and change to B in last st – 64 sc.

Rnd 3: With B, sc in each st around.

Rnd 4: With B, sc in next st, * 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; rep from * to last 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in last 2 sts – 80 sc.

Rnd 5: With B, sc in each st around and change to A in last st.

Rnd 6: With A, sc in each st around.

Rnd 7: With A, sl st in each st around.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
