SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZE

About 8 1/2 in. (21.5 cm) tall x 9 in. (23 cm) long

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® RE-SPUN THICK & QUICK® (Art. #843)
 - #150 Pumice Stone 1 ball (A)
 - #125 Cider 1 ball (B)
 - #144 Wisteria 1 ball (C)
- LION BRAND® crochet hook size G-6 (4 mm)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Crochet hook size 7 (4.5 mm)
2 plastic safety eyes, 10mm diameter
Fiberfill stuffing

GAUGE

16 sc + 16 rnds = about 4 in. (10 cm). EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL FOR THIS PROJECT

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

TECHNIQUE EXPLANATION

Magic Ring: Wrap yarn around index finger. Insert hook into ring on finger, yarn over and draw up a loop. Carefully slip ring from finger and work the sts of Rnd 1 into the ring.

NOTES

- 1. Carla is worked in 4 pieces: Head-Body, Beak, Collar, and Bonnet.
- 2. Head-Body is worked from the Head down to the Body and then down to the base.
- 3. Beak, Collar, and Bonnet are all worked separately.
- 4. Head-Body, Beak, and Bonnet are worked in joined rnds. Do not turn at the beg of rnds. Join last st of each rnd to first st with a sl st. Work first st of each rnd into the same (first) st as the joining sl st.
- 5. Collar is worked back and forth in rows.
- 6. To change yarn color and join at end of a rnd, insert hook in first sc, yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete joining sl st. Fasten off old color. Proceed with new color.
- 7. Exact gauge is not essential for this project. We worked tightly with a small hook so that stuffing wouldn't show through.

SAFETY NOTE

If Goose is intended for a baby or child, be certain that all pieces have been very securely sewn together. Don't leave a baby or child unattended with the Goose!

HEAD-BODY

Head

With larger hook and A, make a magic ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, work 8 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc – you will have 16 sc in this rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, * sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc - 24 sc.

Rnds 4-9: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 10: Ch 1, * sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 18 sc.

Rnds 11-13: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Insert plastic safety eyes on front of Head between Rnds 6 and 7, about 10 sts apart, placing the seam where ends of rnds are joined at the back of the Head.

Rnd 14: Ch 1, * sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 24 sc.

Rnd 15: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

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Body

Rnd 16: Ch 13, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 11 ch; working in sts of Rnd 15, sk next st, sc in next 22 sts, sk next st; working along opposite side of beg ch-13, sc in next 11 ch, 2 sc in next ch; join with sl st in first sc – 48 sc.

- **Rnd 17:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next 46 sts, 2 sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc -50 sc.
- **Rnd 18:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next 48 sts, 2 sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc -52 sc.
- **Rnd 19:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 46 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc 56 sc.
- Rnd 20: Ch 1, sc in first 17 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in
- **Rnd 21:** Ch 1, sc in first 29 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in last 29 sts; join with sl st in first sc 63 sc.
- **Rnd 22:** Ch 1, sc in first 31 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in last 31 sts; join with sl st in first sc -64 sc.
- **Rnd 23:** Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in next 54 sts, sc2tog, sc in next st, sc2tog; join with sl st in first sc 60 sc.
- **Rnd 24:** Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.
- **Rnd 25:** Ch 1, * sc in next 8 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc 54 sc.
- **Rnd 26:** Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 50 sts, sc2tog; join with sl st in first sc 52 sc.
- **Rnd 27:** Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 21 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 21 sts, sc2tog; join with sl st in first sc 48 sc.
- Rnd 28: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.
- Begin stuffing piece and continue stuffing until piece is complete.
- **Rnd 29:** Ch 1, * sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc 40 sc.
- Rnd 30: Ch 1, * sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc 32 sc.
- **Rnd 31:** Ch 1, * sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc AND change to B 24 sc.

Base

- Rnd 32: With B, ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.
- Rnds 33 and 34: Ch 1, working in both loops, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.
- Finish stuffing piece.
- **Rnd 35:** Ch 1, working in back loops only, * sc in next st, sc2tog; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc 16 sc.
- **Rnd 36:** Ch 1, working in both loops, (sc2tog) around; join with sl st in first sc 8 sc.
- Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail.
- Thread tail through top of sts of last rnd, pull to close opening and knot securely.

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BEAK

With larger hook and B, make a magic ring.

- **Rnd 1:** Ch 1, work 6 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.
- **Rnd 2:** Ch 1, (sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st) twice; join with sl st in first sc 8 sc.
- Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st) twice; join with sl st in first sc -10 sc.
- **Rnd 4:** Ch 1, (sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st) twice; join with sl st in first sc -12 sc.
- **Rnd 5:** Ch 1, (sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st) 4 times; join with sl st in first sc 16 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

COLLAR

With smaller hook and C, and leaving a long beg tail, ch 36.

- **Row 1:** SI st in 9th ch from hook (8 skipped ch counts as ch-sp), (ch 5, sk next 2 ch, sI st in next ch) 9 times 10 ch-sps.
- **Row 2:** Ch 6, turn, sl st in first ch-sp, (ch 6, sl st in next ch-sp) 9 times, ch 6, sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-8 11 ch-sps.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for tying Collar in place around neck.

BONNET

With smaller hook and C, make a magic ring.

- **Rnd 1:** Ch 1, work 8 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.
- **Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc 16 sc.
- Rnd 3: Ch 1, * sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc 24 sc.
- Rnd 4: Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in first 5 sts, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st, (2 dc in next st, dc in next st) twice, (dc in next st, 2 dc in next st) twice, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in last 5 sts; join with sl st in first sc 30 sts.
- Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, (hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st) twice, (dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st) twice, (2 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts) twice, (2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st) twice, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts; join with sl st in first sc 40 sts.
- Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first 12 sts, (hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st) twice, (2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts) twice, sc in last 12 sts; join with sl st in first sc 44 sts.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Using photograph as a guide and yarn tails still attached to pieces whenever possible, assemble Carla as follows:

With B, sew Beak to face, between Rnds 5 and 12. Stuff Beak before completing the seam.

With attached yarn tails, tie Collar around neck.

Tie a length of C to each side of Bonnet for ties. Place Bonnet onto Carla and tie at neck.

Weave in ends.
