Hot to Touch

Areas:

Lower Area of Steam Mop Floor

It is normal for the <u>lower front</u>, <u>sides</u>, <u>& back of the steam</u> <u>mop body</u> to get hot, along with the foot area as that is where the steam comes out.

- This is the normal especially during extended use
- It shouldn't be hot from the water tank higher.
- If the consumer notes another area of the steam mop getting hot (ie, the handle etc.), or if they think it is unreasonably hot –

It is also normal for the <u>floor that has been mopped</u> to be hot to the touch, especially immediately after passing over an area.

 Steam on the surface of the floor can be over 88 degrees Celsius and will diminish over time, cooling relatively quickly.
