Cozy Campfire Sweater

SKILL LEVEL – EASY

SIZE

S/M (L/1X, 2X/3X, 4X/5X)

Finished Bust About 40 (48, 56, 64) in. (101.5 (122, 142, 162.5) cm)

Finished Length About 18 1/2 (19 1/2, 20 1/2, 21 1/2) in. (47 (49.5, 52, 54.5) cm)

Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® HOMETOWN® (Art. #135)
 - #153 South Dakota Black 3 (4, 4, 5) balls (A)
 - #111 San Diego Navy 4 (5, 7, 8) balls (B)
 - #133 Syracuse Orange 3 balls (C)
 - #159 Madison Mustard 1 ball (D)
 - #122 Highland Park Beige 1 ball (E)
 - #100 New York White 1 ball (F)
- LION BRAND® stitch markers
- LION BRAND® stitch holders
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle



ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 17 (12 mm), 29 in. (73.5 cm) long

Circular knitting needle size 17 (12 mm), 16 in. (40 cm) long

Double pointed knitting needles size 17 (12 mm)

GAUGE

8 sts + 12 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over St st (k on RS, p on WS).

BE SURE TO CHECK GAUGE.

PATTERN STITCHES

K1, p1 Rib (worked over an odd number of sts)

Row 1: K1, * p1, k1; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep Row 2 for K1, p1 Rib.

K1, p1 Rib (worked in rnds over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1: * K1, p1; rep from * around.

Rep Rnd 1 for K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds.

TECHNIQUE EXPLANATION

3-Needle Bind Off

With RS together, hold in one hand 2 needles with equal number of sts on each. With 3rd needle, knit tog 1 st from each needle, *knit tog 1 st from each needle, pass first st worked over 2nd to bind off; rep from * across. Cut yarn and pull through last st

NOTES

1. Body of Sweater is made from 2 pieces: Back and Front.
2. Back and Front shoulders are joined using 3-Needle Bind Off and side edges are seamed, leaving openings for armholes. Sts are picked up around armholes then the Sleeves are knit in rnds down to cuffs.
3. Back and Front colorwork is worked in intarsia, following Charts. When working intarsia, do not carry yarn across WS of work between color changes, use a separate ball for each section of color. Twist yarns on WS to prevent holes. If carrying color across 5 or more sts, twist yarns on WS to prevent overly long strands (floats) on the WS.
4. Duplicate stitch embellishment is embroidered on top of Front colorwork.
5. Stars are embroidered randomly over Sweater.
6. Circular needle is used to accommodate the number of sts, Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working on straight needles.

BACK

With longer circular needle and A, cast on 41 (49, 57, 65) sts.

Work in K1, p1 Rib until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beg.

Charted Campfire Pattern

Rows 1-7: With A, and beg with a RS (knit) row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 7 rows.

Change to B.

Row 8 (WS): With B, p7 (11, 15, 19), place marker (pm), purl AND change yarn color following Row 8 of Chart 1 to last 7 (11, 15, 19) sts, pm; with B, p to end of row.

Row 9 (RS): With B, k to first marker, slip marker (sm), knit AND change yarn color following Row 9 of Chart 1 to last marker, sm; with B, k to end of row.

Continue working in St st, changing yarn color following Chart 1 between markers and working sts outside markers using same yarn color as Chart 1 edge sts, until all 33 rows of Chart are completed.

Cut A. Remove markers.

Work remainder of piece with B only.

Work in St st until piece measures about 17 (18, 19, 20) in. (43 (45.5, 48.5, 51) cm), end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Neck

Place markers on each side of center 17 (17, 19, 19) sts for back neck.

Dividing Row (RS): K to first marker for right side of neck and place these sts on a holder, bind off sts between markers, remove markers, k to end of row for left side of neck – you will have 12 (16, 19, 23) sts rem on needle for left side of neck.

Left Neck

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2: Bind off 1 st, k to end – 11 (15, 18, 22) sts.

Row 3: Purl.

Place rem 11 (15, 18, 22) sts on a holder.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

Right Neck

Row 1 (RS): From RS, k12 (16, 19, 23) right neck sts from holder.

Row 2 (WS): Bind off 1 st, p to end – 11 (15, 18, 22) sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Place rem 11 (15, 18, 22) sts on a holder.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

FRONT

With longer circular needle and A, cast on 41 (49, 57, 65) sts.

Work in K1, p1 Rib until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beg.

Charted Campfire Pattern

Rows 1-5: With A, and beg with a RS row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 5 rows.

Row 6 (WS): With A, p7 (11, 15, 19), place marker (pm), purl AND change yarn color following Row 6 of Chart 2 to last 7 (11, 15, 19) sts, pm; with A, p to end of row.

Row 7 (RS): With A, k to first marker, slip marker (sm), knit AND change yarn color following Row 7 of Chart 2 to last marker, sm; with A, k to end of row.

Change to B.

Continue working in St st, changing yarn color following Chart 2 between markers and working sts outside markers using same yarn color as Chart 2 edge sts, until all 33 rows of Chart are completed.

Cut A. Remove markers.

Work remainder of piece with B only.

Work in St st until piece measures about 16 (17, 18, 19) in. (40.5 (43, 45.5, 48.5) cm), end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Neck

Place markers on each side of center 5 (5, 7, 7) sts for front neck.

Dividing Row (RS): K to first marker for left side of neck and place these sts on a holder, bind off sts between markers, remove markers, k to end of row for right side of neck – you will have 18 (22, 25, 29) sts rem on needle for right side of neck.

Right Neck

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2: Bind off 3 sts, k to end – 15 (19, 22, 26) sts.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: Bind off 2 sts, k to end – 13 (17, 20, 24) sts.

Rows 5 and 6: Rep Rows 3 and 4 – 11 (15, 18, 22) sts in Row 6.

Row 7: Purl.

Place rem 11 (15, 18, 22) sts on a holder.

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail.

Left Neck

Row 1 (RS): From RS, k18 (22, 25, 29) left neck sts from holder.

Row 2: Bind off 3 sts, p to end – 15 (19, 22, 26) sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Bind off 2 sts, p to end – 13 (17, 20, 24) sts.

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Rows 5 and 6: Rep Rows 3 and 4 – 11 (15, 18, 22) sts in Row 6.

Row 7: Knit.

Place rem 11 (15, 18, 22) sts on a holder.

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail.

Use 3-Needle Bind Off to join shoulders.

Place markers on both side edges of Front and Back, about 8 1/2 (9 1/2, 10 1/2, 11 1/2) in. (21.5 (24, 26.5, 29) cm) from shoulder seams. Sew side seams from lower edge up to markers.

SLEEVES (make 2)

From RS, with shorter circular needle and B, pick up and k30 (34, 38, 42) sts evenly spaced around one armhole edge. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Work in St st worked in rnds (k every st of every rnd) until Sleeve measures about 17 (16, 15 1/2, 14 1/2) in. (43 (40.5, 39.5, 37) cm) from beg.

Change to double pointed needles as you work the decrease rnd.

Decrease Rnd: * K2tog; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2 – 16 (18, 20, 22) sts.

Work in K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds for 2 in. (5 cm).

Bind off.

Rep around remaining armhole edge to make second Sleeve.

FINISHING

Neckband

From RS, with shorter circular needle, beg at a shoulder seam, pick up and k38 (38, 40, 40) sts evenly spaced around neck edge. Place marker for beg of rnd and join.

Work in K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds for about 2 in. (5 cm).

Bind off.

Duplicate Stitch

Following Chart 3, embroider duplicate st D, E, and F colored stitches onto Front colorwork campfire.

Here's how to duplicate st:

1. Thread blunt needle with a length of yarn color indicated on Chart 3.
2. Bring threaded needle through the fabric, from WS to RS, at the point of the V of the stitch you'd like to duplicate.
3. Slide the needle under the stitch ABOVE the one you're duplicating.
4. Next, insert the needle from RS to WS at the same point you began.
5. You will have made a V in the yarn color indicated on Chart 3 over the V in the knitted yarn color.
6. Continue in this way to embroider all the D, E, and F colored sts on Chart 3.
7. When you're finished, bring the needle through to WS and cut yarn, leaving a tail. Weave tail in and out of sts on WS.

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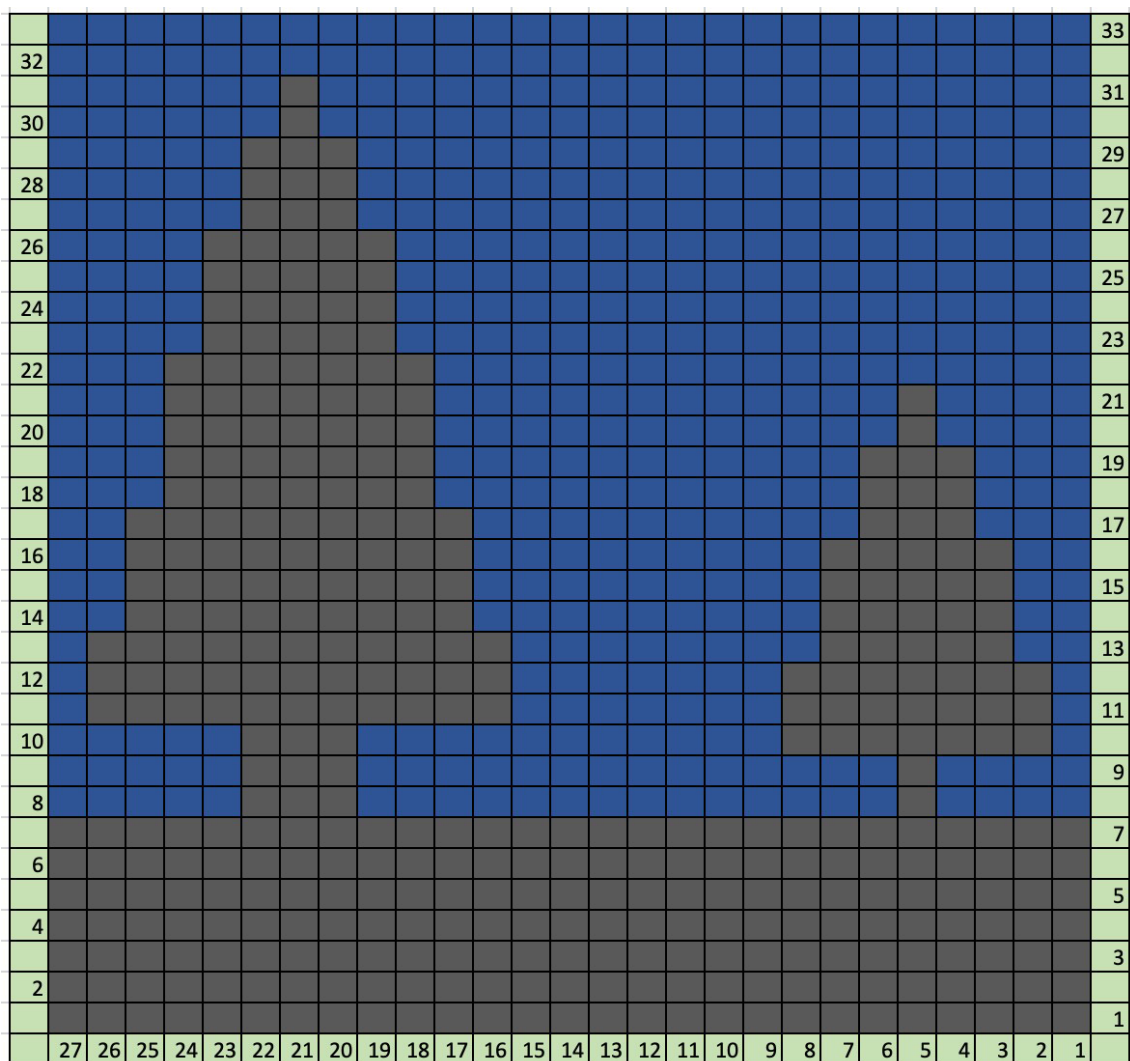
Stars (optional)

Embroider stars randomly over Sweater, as follows:

1. Thread blunt needle with a length of F.
2. Leaving a yarn tail, bring needle from WS to RS into a stitch on the Sweater for center of star.
3. Insert needle, from RS to WS, through a stitch 3 sts from the starting point (center of star) and pull yarn through for one point.
4. Insert needle from WS to RS through center of star again.
5. Rep Steps 3 and 4 to make a total of 4 or 5 points evenly spaced around center of star ending with needle on WS.
6. Cut yarn, leaving a tail. Weave tail in and out of sts on WS.

Weave in ends.

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Chart 2: Front Intarsia

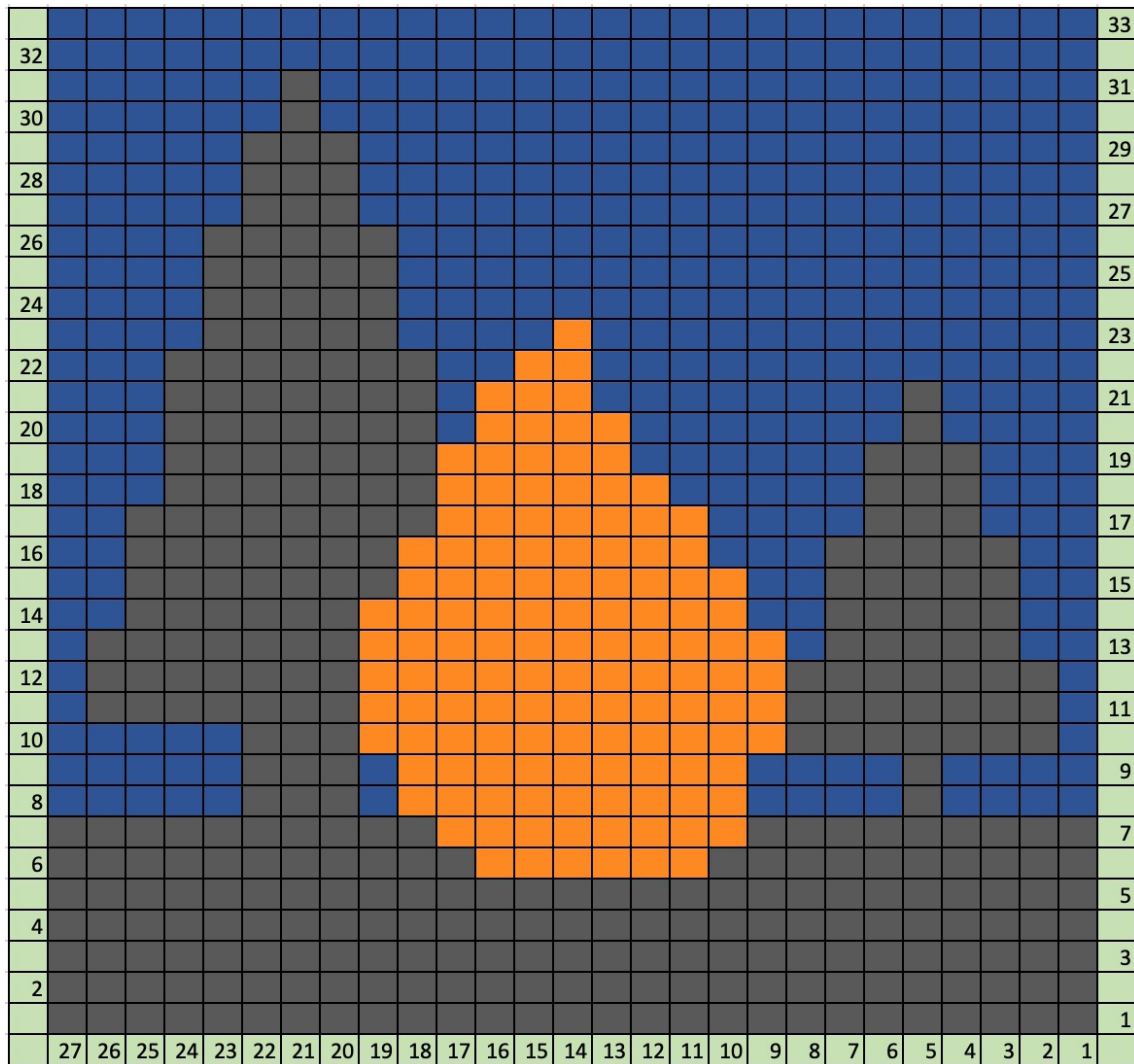
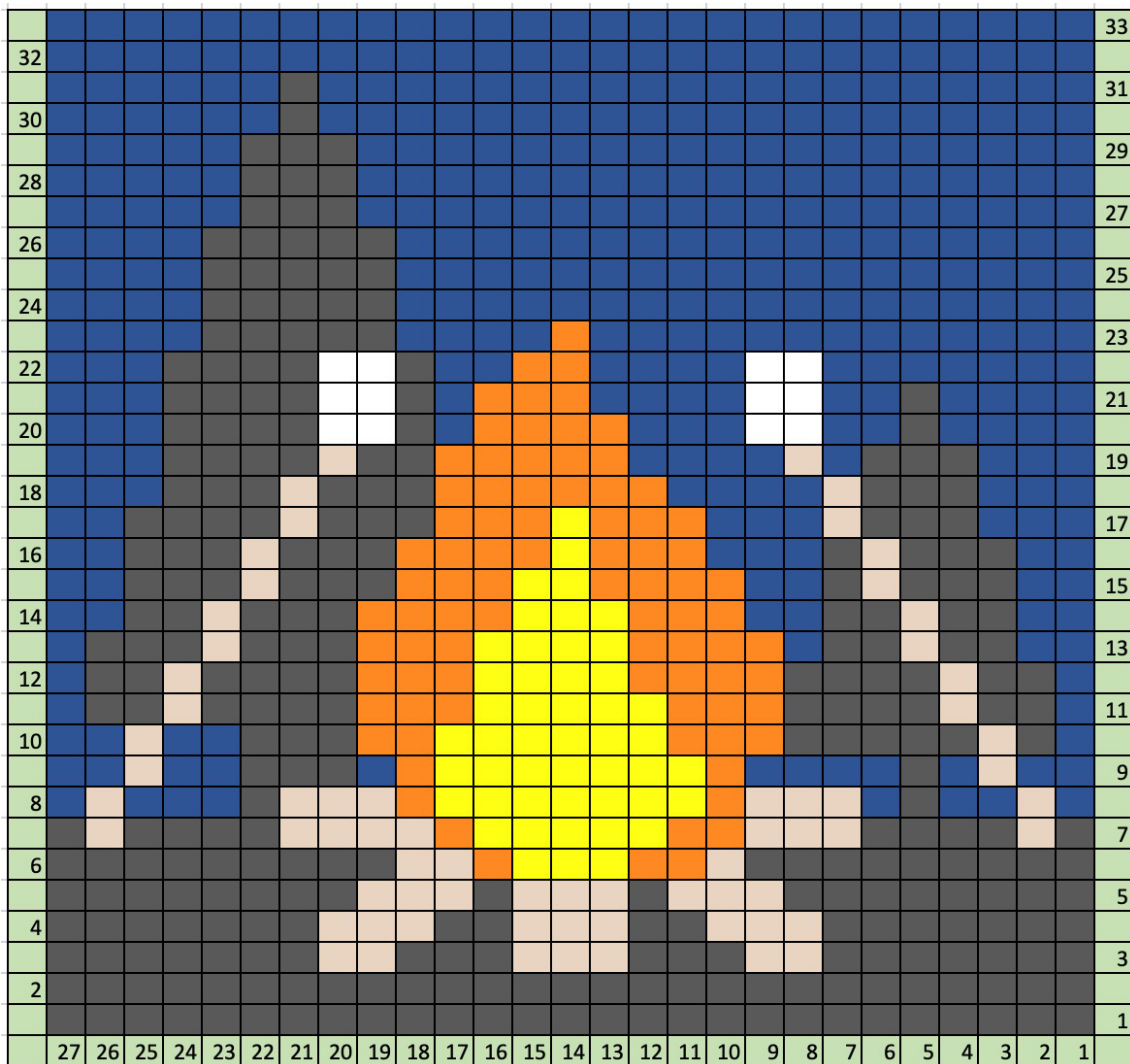


Chart 3: Duplicate Stitch for Front

rep = repeat

RS = right side

st(s) = stitch(es)

St st = Stockinette stitch

WS = wrong side
