

Please be aware that Step Stool, Stol and Bench are made from Solid Oak.

Due to this the Stools and Benches can expand and contract with temperature variances. This can in some circumstances make it difficult to assemble your new stool or bench if it has been recently stored in a cold or humid environment.

If this should be the case then it will be necessary to leave the stool or bench at room temperature for 48hours before completing its assembly.

Please be aware: If using a metal hammer to help with assembly be sure to place a thick piece of cardboard or wood between the metal of the hammer and the wooden peg.

## **Taking care of your Peg Stool**

Your stool has been treated with a clear, water based lacquer. If you need to clean the stool do so with a damp cloth using a mild detergent if needed.

Do not leave the stool wet or soaked for longer periods of time and always remember to dry it off after cleaning.

## **Keep it going forever**

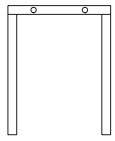

All of our designs are covered with a 5 year warranty from the date of purchase, covering any breakages related to deficient craftsmanship under normal everyday use.

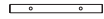
## **Recycling**
