

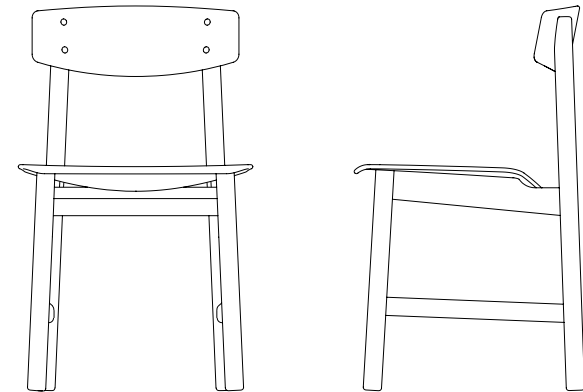

Why FSC®?

All wood in our collection is labeled and produced in FSC® certified wood. When producing furniture from FSC® certified wood we support well-managed forestry. In an FSC® certified forest no more trees than the forest can reproduce are felled, so the exploitation of nature is avoided. FSC® ensures fair wages and a fair trading price and gives full traceability. We can trace a chair back to the forest where the tree was planted.

Made from recycled industrial waste

Conscious Chair is the result of a new innovative waste-to-value technique developed by Mater, that enables us to upcycle companies' industrial waste. The plastic waste from GROHE is mixed with coffee bean waste from BKI coffee - one of Denmark's largest coffee manufacturers.

Take-back system

Our new patented waste composite allows Mater to offer a circular take-back system. This is an essential step towards Mater's vision of becoming one hundred percent circular.

Maintenance guide

Please note that the seat is handcrafted and made from nature fibers, and plastic waste - minor blemishes and imperfections may be visible. These are not considered defects and do not interfere with the quality and function of the product. Always remove stains quickly before they can do any permanent damage to the furniture. When you move your furniture, make sure you lift it rather than pulling or pushing it to avoid damaging the floor, legs and mountings. Avoid improper use such as tilting, putting your feet on the furniture or standing on it. Be careful not to damage or scratch the surface with sharp objects. Minor spots of rust under the furniture and bases are considered as a natural result of general use.

Cleaning

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. Minor scratches or damage to the powder coated surfaces can lead to corrosion. The life expectancy of your furniture will vary depending on the type of use.

Lacquered or stained wood

Lacquered or stained wood offers a stronger surface than oiling and is also effective when coloured surfaces are desired. Compared to natural or oiled wood, lacquered and stained wood is easier to clean and requires very little maintenance.

For daily care it is recommended to dust the furniture with a soft cloth. Lacquered and stained wood can be cleaned with a soft cloth wrung in a mild solution of lukewarm water and a universal cleaning detergent. Always follow the wood grains and always dry with a soft dry cloth immediately after cleaning.

Avoid use of abrasive cleaning agents and aggressive cleaning detergents as this will damage the surface of the lacquered or stained wood. Avoid placing wooden furniture in direct sunlight, excessive heat or humidity.
