Design notes

The owner of this kitchen – Kate Cox of HÁM Interiors – created an unfitted look with deliberately mismatched elements for a relaxed and personal feel. 'I took inspiration from country house kitchens and added a curtain under the sink in a rustic stripe by de Le Cuona,' she says. Shelving opens up the space and the terracotta floor brings a Mediterranean touch. <u>haminteriors.com</u>

Nuts and bolts

Kitchen units with Carrara marble and Belgian bluestone work surfaces; and hardware; all from HÁM Interiors. Force of nature

Nature's Opera, the latest range to be introduced by de Le Cuona, is described as capturing 'the quiet drama and wild wonders of the natural world'. It also sees the company, known for offering luxurious fabrics in understated colourways, work with hemp for the first time. Shown below are sheer curtains in 'Aria' wool/silk in calm, £195 a metre, in front of cushions in 'Carmen' hemp in jasmine, tahini, alabaster and shell, £225 a metre.
