

FACT ONE

THERE ARE THREE DIFFERENT TYPES

Bornean orangutans are the largest tree-dwelling mammals in the world, although they do walk significant distances on the ground. Sumatran orangutans are thinner, have paler red coats, longer hair on their arms and longer more oval faces compared to Bornean orangutans.

Tapanuli orangutans have frizzier hair than Sumatran orangutans, which tend to have long, loose hair.

Orangutans are very dexterous, using both hands and feet while gathering food. Some orangutans show a preference for using their left hand for tasks such as scooping water to drink.

FACT THREE

ORANGUTANS CAN MAKE UP TO 32 DIFFERENT SOUNDS

The orangutan's 'long call' can be heard by people up to 1,500m away. It can last one to two minutes, gradually building from a grumble to a full blown roar before a gradual subsiding repetitive gurgling. These calls are only carried out by flanged adult males as the call is amplified by their inflated throat pouch. Orangutans also make a sound called the 'kiss squeak' - which usually indicates tension or potential danger.



INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Fill about three-quarters of the planter with some sieved peat-free soil or multi-purpose compost, which you can buy from garden centres. The soil or compost needs to be damp. Press the soil down to make a flat surface, and make sure you don't cover the cross pin in the planter.



STEP 2

For one crop, evenly scatter half of the coriander seeds from the packet into the planter and cover with a thin layer of soil or compost. Seal the seed packet back up and store it in a dry and cool place for a second crop.



STEP 3

To assemble the playset, plug the large tree branch into the cross pin in the planter. Next, slot the large and medium tree platforms onto the branch. Pop the second branch on top of this and place the last two trees on top.



Attach the hanging vine onto the bottom of one of the medium platforms. Your Orangutans' Treetop Adventure is complete!

STEP 4

Place the pot on a warm windowsill or similarly in a well-lit position and water regularly.

At night when the temperature drops, remove the playset and use the plastic dome as a propagator to keep the plants warm and encourage the seedlings to grow.



STEP 5

You should start to see your coriander sprouting 7 days after sowing, and it should be ready to eat when it has grown approximately 15cm tall. Pick off the leaves, give them a wash and they are ready to add to your food - like curry or on top of a soup!
