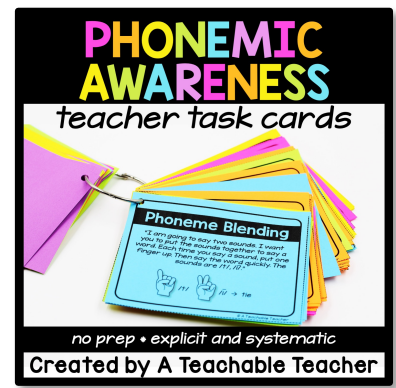

Words in a Sentence

"I'm going to say a sentence. I want you to count how many words are in the sentence. Every time I say a word, count with your fingers. Let's try it together!"

The dog is white.



Note: You can also model and practice clapping each word in the sentence.
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Words in a Sentence

- I see the car.
- The car is big.
- The car is blue.
- The car is big and blue.
- Can I ride in the car?

Words in a Sentence

- I see you.
- We see the dog.
- The dog is little.
- The dog is really smart.
- We like to pet the dog.

Words in a Sentence

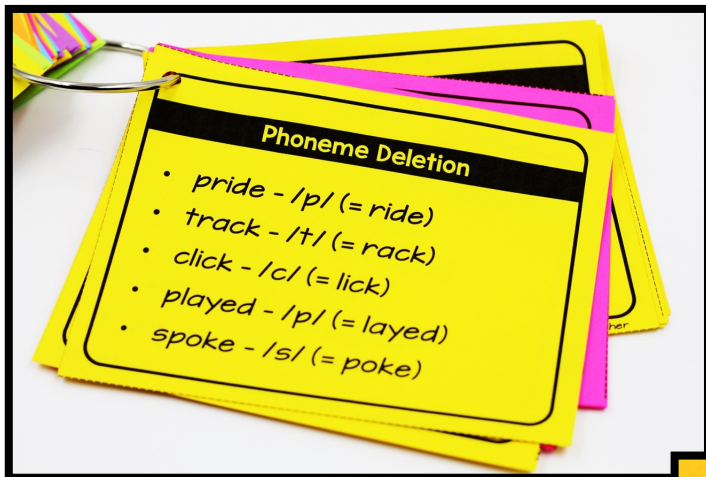
- We like school.
- Our school is big.
- We learn to read.
- We learn math.
- School makes us smart.

two cuts per page creates evenly sized cards

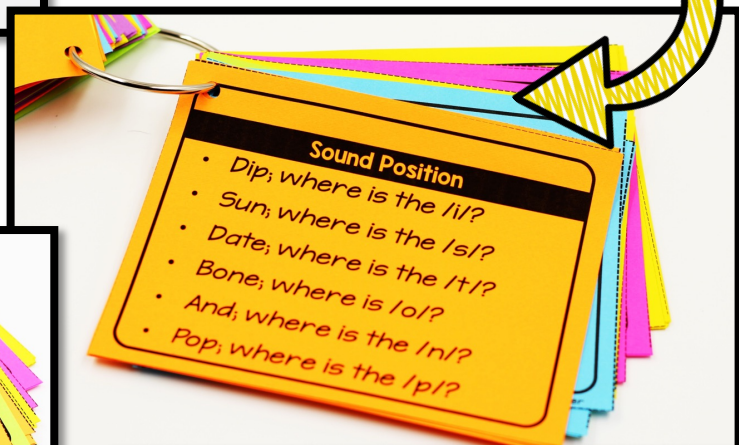
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Ideas:

I actually go back and forth, so the skills are spiraling. For example, I might do some beginning sound discrimination in the morning and some alliterations in the afternoon.
