

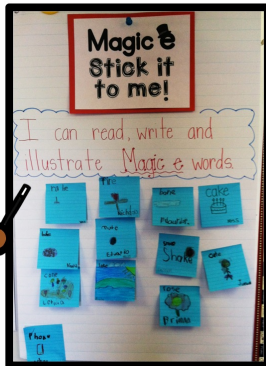

Note to the Fabulous Teacher

Anchor Chart Activity

- Print out the "Magic e Stick it to Me!" page. Glue it on the top of an anchor chart. I also wrote an I-Can statement.
- Review Magic e words with your students.
- Give each student a sticky note. Have them choose a word, write it at the top of the note and draw a picture.
- When students have finished, have each student share their sticky note with the class before placing it on the chart.
- Leave the chart up while you practice Magic e!



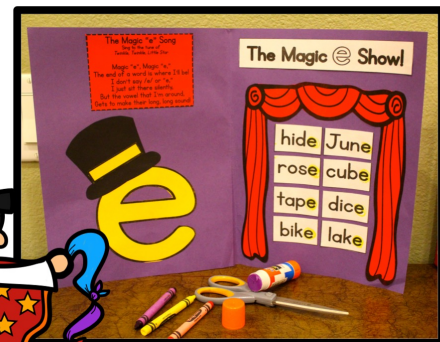

Magic e Craftivity

- Print out Craft Pages 1-4. Copy and glue according to the directions on each page.
- Glue "e", hat and hat accent on the left side of purple construction paper. Glue the song on top.
- On the right side, glue the title at the top. Then glue the curtains. Cut and glue *only* magic e words underneath.
- Note: I emphasized to my students that they should arrange the words on the page before gluing. Space is limited! 😊
