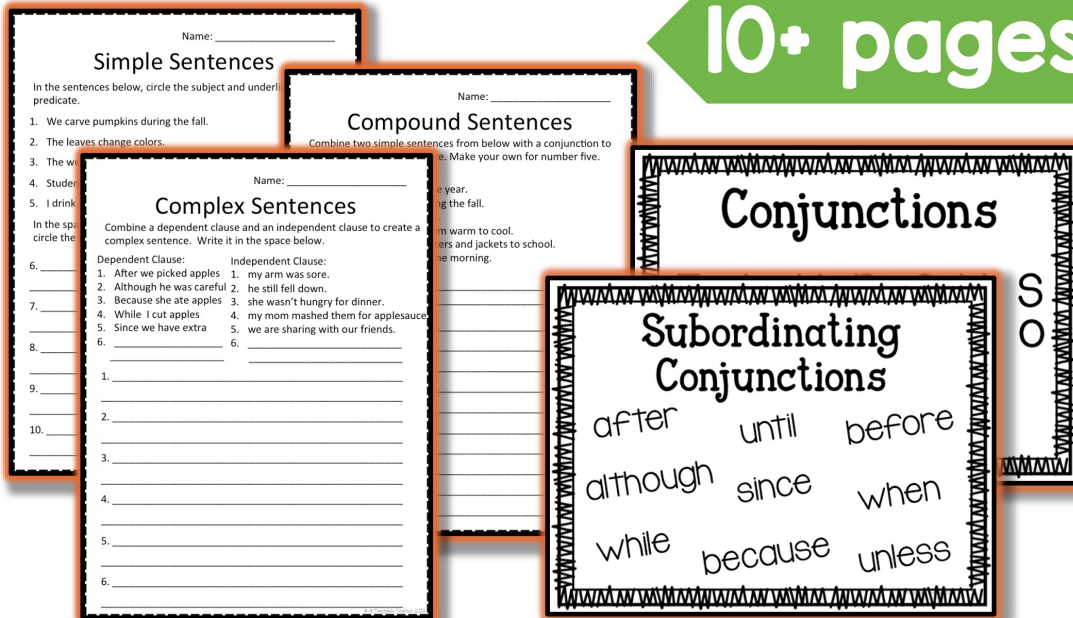

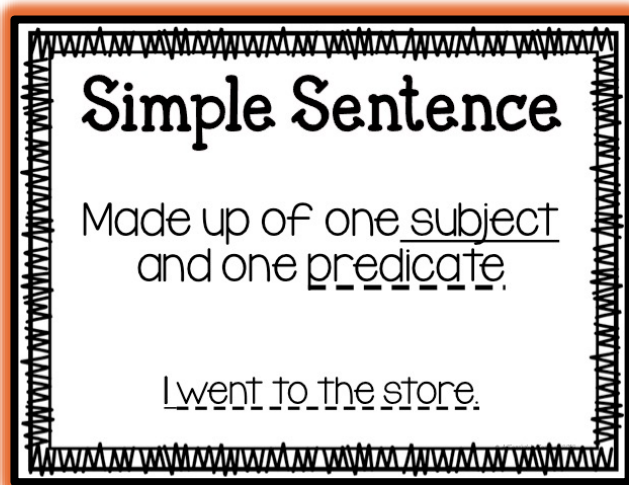

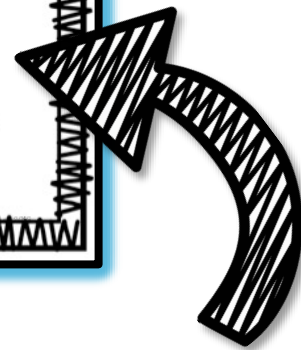

I went to the store, and my dad went to the store.



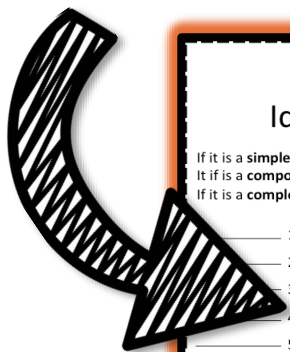
